#### Agenda Item #1: Call to Order/Opening Remarks

Ms. Fabian Wesson called the meeting to order at 12:07 pm.

Mrs. Wesson invited everyone to the Environmental Justice Conference on September 12, 2019 and the Clean Air Awards October 4, 2019.

#### **Agenda Item #2: Approval of Minutes**

Ms. Jessica Tovar moved to approve the June 5, 2019 Advisory Council meeting minutes. Mr. Oscar Rodriguez seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.

#### Agenda Item #3: Review of Follow-Up/Action Items

Mrs. Wesson reviewed and provided updates on the action items from the June 5, 2019 meeting. Mrs. Wesson informed the Advisory Council on the Clean Air Ranger Education (CARE) Program, provided a list of current members on the Inter-Agency Task Force, and confirmed that, per South Coast AQMD's legal department, childcare would not be provided for the AB617 program. Mrs. Wesson stated (at the time of this meeting) South Coast AQMD will include a Request for Proposals for interpretation at the October board meeting, however this item has been delayed until early 2020.

#### **Agenda Item #4: South Coast AQMD Complaint Reporting Process**

Mr. Victor Yip, Senior Enforcement Manager presented on South Coast AQMD's complaint reporting system, types of complaints received, complaint trends, and an overview of the investigation process.

Mr. Eddie Marquez asked if one complaint would trigger an investigation. Mr. Yip replied that during business hours a single complaint would be dispatched to an inspector, and during off hours three complaints would be needed within an hour for an inspector to be dispatched.

Ms. Sahara Huazano asked how South Coast AQMD is promoting the complaint number for people to make reports and inquiries. Mr. Yip and Mrs. Wesson replied that staff's outreach efforts include social media, public meetings, presentations, and events. Mrs. Alicia Rodriguez replied that the number can be found on South Coast AQMD promotional items as well.

Ms. Lisa Hart asked if a complaint is a known issue, does South Coast AQMD go out and investigate or does the investigator just follow up with the person on the phone? Mr. Yip replied South Coast AQMD goes out to investigate known issues because violations are on a per day basis. Ms. Hart also asked, how quickly South Coast AQMD staff respond to reported complaints. Mr. Yip replied it depends on geographical sectors and staff to do their best to respond within a couple hours. If compliance staff are in the middle of an inspection, time is needed to wrap up the current inspection first before moving on. Ms. Hart also asked how South Coast AQMD addresses complaints that do not fall under their jurisdiction. Mr. Yip replied that if South Coast AQMD does not have the authority, staff will provide them the information to the appropriate agency.

Mr. Marquez asked if a home-based vehicle painting business falls under South Coast AQMD's jurisdiction. Mr. Yip replied that although the coating being used may fall under South Coast AQMD's jurisdiction, entry into a private residence does not.

Ms. Tovar asked how many air quality inspectors South Coast AQMD employs and what kind of training is needed to give community members the ability to apply for these types of jobs. Mr. Yip replied that there are over 80 inspectors and four specialized teams that handle various complaints. Mr. Yip also mentioned that South Coast AQMD is in the middle of the recruitment process, and that no training requirements are needed for applying for inspector positions. Approximately 10 weeks of training is given once a position is obtained. A degree is not required but desired, and 34 units of science-based course work is required.

Ms. Julia Jordan asked what happens when you get a call or receive a complaint from an agricultural facility. Mr. Yip replied that South Coast AQMD notifies the facility and encourages them to mitigate the issue on their own. Compost facilities are under agricultural exemption.

Ms. Huazano asked what does South Coast AQMD do about economic burdens on families affected by the Salton Sea in Coachella Valley and if the same complaint process is used for these situations. Mrs. Nancy Feldman, Principal Deputy District Counsel replied that no one person or facility is causing the odor within the Salton Sea and South Coast AQMD cannot cite a natural resource. There is no jurisdiction for South Coast AQMD.

#### Agenda Item #5: EJCP Update

Ms. Rodriguez provided an update on the Environmental Justice Conference, on September 12th, 2019. She also gave updates on the CARE Program and noted two upcoming assemblies, 20th Street Elementary school in Los Angeles County on October 3rd, and North Verdemont Elementary School in San Bernardino County on November 15th. Ms. Rodriguez shared the four goals of the Inter-Agency Task Force and that the next meeting is in Los Angeles on September 25, 2019.

Ms. Rodriguez invited members to present at the December 4, 2019 Advisory Council meeting. She also invited members to request presentations on specific topics.

#### **Member Updates**

Mr. Todd Heibel announced that San Bernardino Valley College is partnering with South Coast AQMD by installing several air quality monitors on campus which will allow students to gain experience with air quality issues.

Ms. Tovar is working on a freight automation study for the community that will be released within the next 18 months, detailing concerns and policy recommendations.

Mr. Rodriguez was successful in helping the Ocean View School District mitigate the Rainbow Environmental Services issues, which ultimately allowed for a four million dollar new gym facility that is now open.

Ms. Hart is working on developing aspirational guidelines for developers, detailing how they can have influential conversations on how to best build carbon neutral buildings. She also informed the Advisory Council about Congress of Neighborhoods, an annual event on Saturday, September 28, 2019 at City Hall.

Mr. Jin Zhu does outreach and education on behalf of the California Air Resources Board in San Bernardino and Riverside Counties, specifically targeted at disadvantaged communities.

Ms. Huazano is conducting work around education equity to reduce suspensions and expulsions in middle schools and will soon begin at the high school level. Her organization is also working on environmental justice issues such as the Salton Sea as well as organizing a Youth Council.

Ms. Ada Briceño is working with developers to make sure they are protecting workers' rights and hiring people within the local area in order to cut down on travel time to and from work.

Ms. Paula Andrea Torrado-Plazas is conducting the second round of the Air Quality Academy on September 27th and 28th.

## Environmental Justice Community Partnership Advisory Council 2019 Accomplishments

The mission of the Advisory Council is to ensure that the Environmental Justice Community Partnership (EJCP) programs address the air quality concerns of diverse communities throughout South Coast AQMD's jurisdiction. The goals of the Advisory Council are to:

- 1. Support South Coast AQMD's EJCP efforts;
- 2. Advise the EJCP on environmental justice issues affecting the South Coast Air Basin; and
- 3. Help strengthen and build upon South Coast AQMD's relationships and alliances within the community.

The South Coast AQMD Governing Board approved the charter in 2016 to support South Coast AQMD's environmental justice efforts. During 2019, Advisory Council members convened to receive updates and discuss environmental justice and air quality issues.

#### **Key Items Addressed in 2019**

#### **EJCP Program Input**

South Coast AQMD held quarterly Advisory Council meetings in 2020. Staff provided members with ongoing updates on the EJCP events, workshops, and meetings. Advisory Council members provided feedback on these initiatives at South Coast AQMD.

#### **Advisory Council Members: Community Efforts**

Advisory Council member, Ada Briceño presented on her ongoing environmental justice work at UNITE HERE Local 11. Ms. Briceño explained that the 32,000 members, represent workers employed in hotels, restaurants, airports, sports arenas, and convention centers throughout Southern California and Arizona. She stated those most impacted by air pollution live, work, and go to school in disadvantaged communities. Many members cannot afford to live in communities with better air quality and the environmental needs are not being met.

Advisory Council member, Paula Andrea Torrado-Plazas gave a presentation on Physicians for Social Responsibility- Los Angeles's ongoing efforts within the community to address air pollution concerns. Ms. Torrado-Plazas informed the Advisory Council of the "South Central Los Angeles Project to Understand Sources of Air Pollution and Health Impacts," a collaborative effort between organizations, academics and residents to better understand air quality, and health in South LA.

#### **Assembly Bill 617**

Staff provided Advisory Council members with ongoing updates and recent accomplishments of Assembly Bill 617 implementation in the selected communities. Since the Assembly Bill passed in 2017, South Coast AQMD worked closely with community stakeholders to identify the community steering committee (CSC) members to participate in the community emissions reduction programs. Throughout the year, AB 617 goals, initiatives, community steering committees, and timelines for the next one to five-year span were discussed at Advisory Council meetings.

#### Implemented the Clean Air Ranger Education (CARE) Program

The South Coast AQMD conducted assembly presentations to educate students, at the elementary school level, on air pollution issues. The presentations were a great way to introduce youth to air quality and teach them to read the air quality index by color. Advisory Council members were instrumental in connecting South Coast AQMD staff to schools and providing suggestions to improve the presentations.

#### **Held Inter-Agency Task Force Meetings**

South Coast AQMD held quarterly Environmental Justice Inter-Agency Task Force meetings in 2020. There were some Advisory Council members that also participated in the Task Force.

#### **Community EJ Bus Tour**

The South Coast AQMD engaged university students in learning how air pollution affects environmental justice communities, by hosting an Environmental Justice Bus Tour. The tour included visiting neighborhoods that are directly impacted by industrial facilities, ports, and the goods movement. The goal was to promote environmental justice awareness while encouraging students to become more involved in South Coast AQMD's clean air mission.

#### Hosted the Fifth Annual Environmental Justice Conference

The South Coast AQMD hosted the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Environmental Justice Conference, Building Alliances and Progressive Solutions in Los Angeles. The conference brought together policymakers, environmental justice organizations, health and industry professionals, community leaders, and residents to address environmental and public health issues. The Advisory Council assisted throughout the year on the agenda, breakout session topics, and community outreach strategies.

Presentation on the Facility Information Detail (F.I.N.D.) on the South Coast AQMD Website and App Staff presented on a web-based application that allows users to search for public information on South Coast AQMD's regulated facilities that require to have a permit to operate equipment.

#### South Coast AQMD Complaint Reporting Process and Investigation Procedure

Staff presented an overview on South Coast AQMD's complaint reporting system, types of complaints received, complaint trends, and the investigation process.




