Agenda Item #4: Update on Emergency Orders for Crematoriums

Mr. Jason Aspell provided an overview of South Coast AQMD's expired Emergency Order for Crematoriums effective January 2021 to April 2021. Mr. Aspell explained the order requirements, the monitoring process of participating crematoriums and extensions that were placed to protect public health.

Mr. Rodriguez asked about the percentage of crematorium facilities located near residential and school zones. Mr. Aspell did not have an exact percentage.

Ms. Briceño inquired information on outreach to Orange County. Mr. Aspell shared that outreach was conducted to Funeral Directors Association as well as County coroner offices.

Mr. Moses Huerta asked if the Emergency Order included medical waste facilities. Mr. Aspell responded that it did not include medical waste facilities.

Agenda Item #5: San Bernardino Valley College Air Quality Mapping Project

Mr. Todd Heibel presented on San Bernardino Valley College's proposed air quality mapping project using the geographic information systems (GIS) program in the Inland Empire.

Mr. Moses Huerta asked if data was being collected on aviation pollution from nearby airports. Mr. Heibel shared that the data on aviation pollution was not being collected.

Mr. Rodriguez asked if her department was tracking health issues in their school toxics program. Ms. Atcitty responded in the affirmative and stated it is the reason the EPA stepped in to provide monitors for their School Toxics Program.

- 2 years of advocacy led to litigation and eventually a \$30 Million investment from the State to support relocation
- Continued advocacy to include residents in the implementation of this funding





Energy + Climate Resilience



- Antiquated and unreliable electric infrastructure
- Extreme weather events and climate change having severe impacts on infrastructure
- Day long power outages and other consequences
- Residents organizing for better representation and climate resilient infrastructure
- Ongoing engagement with elected officials and advocacy around different types of funding






