#### **ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

1. **Review and Approve Proposals for the ExxonMobil Supplemental Environmental Project Fund:** Tracy Goss, Planning & Rules Manager, presented background information on the ExxonMobil settlement funds of \$2,771.250 that were paid to the SCAQMD by the Torrance Refinery as a result of the explosion of 2015 and the 2016 refinery restart. The Board established a Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) Fund in June 2016. Mr. Goss described the available funding, summarized the mitigation project proposals submitted, and described the evaluation process and the resulting RFP review panel recommendations.

The RFP process involved sequential rounds of community participation. In August 2016, a community meeting was held to solicit ideas, including roundtable discussions. The RFP was issued in September 2016, followed by a bidder's conference and office hours where staff were available to provide assistance to anyone interested in submitting a proposal. The proposal date was extended to November 2, 2016. As a result of the community meeting, the focus was placed on air quality monitoring, emergency preparedness, public education, outreach, community notification, as well as infrastructure improvements. A total of 15 proposals were received for cumulative funding requests of \$15 million. The submittals fell into the following categories: air monitoring; alert and public notification systems; modeling; emergency preparedness; and public education. Criteria considered in the evaluation included the expertise of the proposer, if there were potential public health improvements or measurable air quality benefits, effective use of funds, and support from the community and local government.

Staff recommendations were to fund Sonoma Technology for up to three years at an estimated funding level of \$2,171,250 total; and to fund integration of the monitoring with a City of Torrance community alert and information system for up to three years at an estimated funding level of \$600,000 total. Changes to funding amounts may occur due to negotiations to combine the respective projects.

Approximately 17 individuals spoke on this item for an approximate one-hour period; speakers are listed in the Attachment. The majority of the speakers supported the staff recommendations. Dr. G. Eng, a Torrance resident, requested that the concern for a potential HF catastrophic release be addressed and requested that SCAQMD consider his proposal for funding to address the HF issue.
