#### Call to Order

Chair Burke called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

#### **INFORMATIONAL ITEM:**

#### 1. 2019 PM2.5 Summary and Progress Towards Federal Standards

Dr. Scott Epstein, Program Supervisor/ Planning, Rule Development, and Area Sources presented a summary of PM2.5 levels in 2019 and progress towards PM2.5 attainment. A preliminary study on impacts to air quality from COVID-19 was also presented.

Dr. Burke asked if the agency should start examining impacts from nanoparticles, also known as ultrafine particles. Dr. Philip Fine, Deputy Executive Officer/Planning, Rule Development, and Area Sources responded that there has been a lot of work over the past decade from many entities regarding ultrafine particles, such as health effects, atmospheric chemistry, and measurements. There is evidence from these studies that there are additional health effects from ultrafine particles. There are no air quality standards currently set for ultrafine particles by the CARB the U.S. EPA, but there could be regulations set in the future.

Dr. Burke then asked Dr. Fine if he was aware of the findings from research conducted by the Health Effects of Air Pollution Foundation at Cedars Sinai Medical Center, UCLA, and USC and what those findings were. Dr. Fine replied that ultrafine particles are so small that they can translocate to other organ systems throughout the body without passing through the lungs. Dr. Burke followed up by asking if we should be looking at ultrafine particles in the future instead of PM2.5. Dr. Fine responded that we have looked at ultrafine particles in our MATES studies and have funded research. As we come into attainment for PM2.5, ultrafine particles will likely be the next pollutant of focus.

Dr. Burke asked how many people might die in the next 10 years from the impacts of ultrafine particles. Dr. Fine responded that it is hard to estimate as we do not have epidemiology studies to determine these numbers. Mr. Wayne Nastri, Executive Officer also replied that moving to zero emissions through vehicle electrical batteries or fuel cells will help to address the impacts from particle emissions. Dr. Fine added that ultrafine particles behave much differently in the atmosphere than PM2.5. However, any efforts to reduce NOx and PM2.5 emissions will help to reduce emissions of ultrafine particles.

Council Member Rodriguez asked why the winter months were prevalent for the exceedances of 24-hour PM2.5. Dr. Epstein replied this is due to favorable meteorology for the formation of PM2.5 (cool, calm, and foggy conditions) combined with residential wood burning.

Council Member Rodriguez asked Dr. Epstein what happened in 2017 versus the 2018-2019 period. Dr. Epstein replied that 2017 had a few high days for PM2.5, predominately in Compton during the holiday period. These high days were attributed to meteorological conditions and residential wood burning. Dr. Burke asked how we explain that residential wood smoke was contributing to 24-hour PM2.5 exceedances in Compton. Dr. Epstein replied that we were able to determine this due to measured levoglucosan levels. Levoglucosan is a unique wood smoke tracer and is a product of cellulose combustion in wood. Dr. Burke asked if that meant that Compton residents were burning wood in wood-burning fireplaces. Dr. Fine responded that this doesn't necessarily mean wood smoke is directly from

Compton, as this could be due to wildfire smoke or residential wood smoke transported from surrounding cities.

Supervisor Bartlett asked what criteria the South Coast AQMD uses for air monitor placement in a city. Dr. Fine replied that some monitoring stations have historically been in place for decades to capture trends in air quality. Other stations have moved as necessary to monitor impacts or to monitor for new ambient air quality standards. The U.S. EPA sets guidance for how air quality agencies site monitors. Monitoring stations are chosen for a variety of reasons, such as to capture high concentrations, upwind concentrations, geographical diversity, and impacts from major roadways. Monitor network assessments are done every five years as required by the U.S. EPA.

Dr. Burke asked Mr. Nastri if PM2.5 in Compton was caused by the emitters that he viewed during a Compton community meeting. Mr. Nastri replied that those facilities were being investigated for localized toxic emissions, not wood smoke emissions. The South Coast AQMD has seen shifts in the locations of the highest PM2.5 concentrations as air quality improves. This also emphasizes that we need to continue our education to the public on the impacts of wood burning.

Dr. Burke expressed his concern about the 20%-33% traffic reductions on the freeways due to COVID-19 and that the reductions should be greater than presented. Dr. Fine explained these numbers only represent auto traffic from freeways and do not represent side street traffic. This data comes from sensors on the roads that measure cars and trucks as they pass by. Dr. Burke suggested that South Coast AQMD staff contact Caltrans to get explanations about the traffic counts. Dr. Fine replied that staff will follow up with Caltrans.

Mayor McCallon asked if we could use the data collected during the COVID-19 time frame to adjust our ozone models to examine our NOx emission reduction strategies. Dr. Fine responded that if this event continues through the summer and we can determine the emission changes, this will provide a natural experiment for our models to determine if we are capturing the atmospheric chemistry correctly. This will help validate or adjust our models. Dr. Burke added that we will be impacted across the board and this might require the agency to adjust future priorities. Dr. Fine responded that there could be longer term economic impacts that could last months to years, and we will have to track those impacts closely.

There were no public comments on this item.

CEQA Document Receipt and Review Logs (Attachments A and B) – Each month, the South Coast AQMD receives numerous CEQA documents from other public agencies on projects that could adversely affect air quality. A listing of all documents received during the reporting period March 1, 2020 and March 31, 2020 is included in Attachment A. A list of active projects from previous reporting periods for which South Coast AQMD staff is continuing to evaluate or has prepared comments is included in Attachment B. A total of 61 CEQA documents were received during this reporting period and 25 comment letters were sent.

The Intergovernmental Review function, which consists of reviewing and commenting on the adequacy of the air quality analysis in CEQA documents prepared by other lead agencies, is consistent with the Board's 1997 Environmental Justice Guiding Principles and Environmental Justice Initiative #4. As required by the Environmental Justice Program Enhancements for FY 2002-03, approved by the Board in October 2002, each attachment notes proposed projects where the South Coast AQMD has been contacted regarding potential air quality-related environmental justice concerns. The South Coast AQMD has established an internal central contact to receive information on projects with potential air quality-related environmental justice concerns. The public may contact the South Coast AQMD about projects of concern by the following means: in writing via fax,

email, or standard letters; through telephone communication; and as part of oral comments at South Coast AQMD meetings or other meetings where South Coast AQMD staff is present. The attachments also identify, for each project, the dates of the public comment period and the public hearing date, if applicable. Interested parties should rely on the lead agencies themselves for definitive information regarding public comment periods and hearings as these dates are occasionally modified by the lead agency.

At the January 6, 2006 Board meeting, the Board approved the Workplan for the Chairman's Clean Port Initiatives. One action item of the Chairman's Initiatives was to prepare a monthly report describing CEQA documents for projects related to goods movement and to make full use of the process to ensure the air quality impacts of such projects are thoroughly mitigated. In response to describing goods movement, CEQA documents (Attachments A and B) are organized to group projects of interest into the following categories: goods movement projects; schools; landfills and wastewater projects; airports; general land use projects, etc. In response to the mitigation component, guidance information on mitigation measures was compiled into a series of tables relative to: off-road engines; on-road engines; harbor craft; ocean-going vessels; locomotives; fugitive dust; and greenhouse gases. These mitigation measure tables are on the CEQA webpages portion of the South Coast AQMD's website at: <a href="http://www.aqmd.gov/home/regulations/ceqa/air-quality-analysis-handbook/mitigation-measures-and-control-efficiencies">http://www.aqmd.gov/home/regulations/ceqa/air-quality-analysis-handbook/mitigation-measures for other emission sources.</a>

Staff focuses on reviewing and preparing comments for projects: where the South Coast AQMD is a responsible agency; that may have significant adverse regional air quality impacts (e.g. special event centers, landfills, goods movement); that may have localized or toxic air quality impacts (e.g. warehouse and distribution centers); where environmental justice concerns have been raised; and which a lead or responsible agency has specifically requested South Coast AQMD review. If staff provided written comments to the lead agency as noted in the column "Comment Status," there is a link to the "South Coast AQMD Letter" under the Project Description. In addition, if staff testified at a hearing for the proposed project, a notation is provided under the "Comment Status." If there is no notation, then staff did not provide testimony at a hearing for the proposed project.

During the period March 1, 2020 and March 31, 2020, the South Coast AQMD received 61 CEQA documents. Attachment B lists documents that are ongoing active projects. Of the 70 documents listed in Attachments A and B:

- 25 comment letters were sent;
- 28 documents were reviewed, but no comments were made;
- 12 documents are currently under review;
- 0 document did not require comments (e.g., public notices);
- 0 document were not reviewed; and
- 5 documents were screened without additional review.

(The above statistics are from March 1, 2020 and March 31, 2020, and may not include the most recent "Comment Status" updates in Attachments A and B.)

South Coast AQMD Lead Agency Projects (Attachment C) – Pursuant to CEQA, the South Coast AQMD periodically acts as lead agency for stationary source permit projects. Under CEQA, the lead agency is responsible for determining the type of CEQA document to be prepared if the proposal for action is considered to be a "project" as defined by CEQA. For example, an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) is prepared when the South Coast AQMD, as lead agency, finds substantial evidence that the project may have significant adverse effects on the environment. Similarly, a Negative Declaration (ND) or Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) may be prepared if the South Coast AQMD determines that the project will not generate significant adverse environmental impacts, or the impacts can be mitigated to less than significance. The ND and MND are written statements describing the reasons why projects will not have a significant adverse effect on the environment and, therefore, do not require the preparation of an EIR.

Attachments C to this report summarizes the active projects for which the South Coast AQMD is lead agency and is currently preparing or has prepared environmental documentation. As noted in Attachment C, the South Coast AQMD continued working on the CEQA documents for two active projects during February.
