Call to Order

Committee Chair Perez called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. For additional details of the Climate Change Committee Meeting, please refer to the <u>Webcast</u>.

ROLL CALL

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

1. Summary of the Fifth National Climate Assessment and Air Quality Chapter Allison Crimmins, Director, National Climate Assessment (NCA) and Chris Nolte, Federal Coordinating Lead Author on Air Quality Chapter of NCA provided an overview of the Fifth National Climate Assessment. Chair Perez inquired about the assessment of economics and social justice and how industry and communities can thrive. Ms. Crimmins replied that the report describes how the benefits of taking action often heavily outweigh the costs of those actions.

Chair Perez requested a one-page summary for legislators to understand the big picture to advocate for these issues. For additional details, please refer to the Webcast beginning 26:20.

Supervisor Hagman commented on the vastly differing regional air quality issues and regulations in the United States and inquired how the burden of investment costs associated with air quality improvements in individual climate regions might be spread out at a national level to help those in highly impacted areas. The presenters stated that the document is not policy prescriptive and does not give policy recommendations but shows examples of what works and what does not work in communities. 2. What Happens at United Nations Climate Change Conferences – A Local Regulators Perspective

Dr. Alberto Ayala, Executive Director, Sacramento Metropolitan AQMD gave a presentation on his experience attending the 28th meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP 28).

Committee Chair Perez commented that South Coast AQMD should also be participating in national and international air quality issues and commented that air quality effects and economic impacts need to be balanced and that no regional policy should be mandated at the federal level without funding and policy actions at the federal level, and the need for affordable technologies, especially for those that are resource constrained. Mayor Cacciotti stated that the Pope had issued statements regarding climate change and inquired if Dr. Ayala noticed if faith-based groups had any impact at COP 28. Dr. Ayala responded that he was not aware of participation levels or impacts.

Harvey Eder, Public Solar Power Coalition, commented with concerns about climate change.

3. Other Business

Executive Officer Wayne Nastri indicated that staff would be developing a draft charter based on the committee's feedback for discussion for a future meeting.

Supervisor Hagman stated that he has difficulty reconciling competing needs for different entities for which he is a Board Member and commented that staff should work towards aligning goals. Mr. Nastri replied that staff coordinates closely with many agencies and organizations and welcomes additional coordination.

Supervisor Perez stated that the Climate Change Committee should be a standing committee and that South Coast AQMD should consider eventually establishing an annual air quality conference with agencies and groups participating in workshops contributing to air quality solutions. Councilmember Cacciotti commented that the annual air quality conference should include faith-based groups.

Mr. Eder commented on the difficulty in accessing meetings. Chairman Perez inquired if staff could investigate. Mr. Nastri replied that staff would explore options.
