COMMUNITY MEETING

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) is holding a community meeting to provide information on permit applications filed by the Los Angeles County Chief Executive Office (LA County) to construct and operate a landfill gas collection and control system at a portion of the Cogen Landfill located at 2001 ½ Sheriff Road in Los Angeles, California. LA County is one of four owners of this landfill.

The South Coast AQMD requires facilities to obtain a permit to install, operate or modify equipment that could be a source or control of air pollution within the agency's jurisdiction. If the proposed equipment is located within 1,000 feet of a school, South Coast AQMD requires the facility to distribute a public notice. The proposed equipment will be located within 1000 feet of City Terrace Elementary School.

Cogen Landfill began operations in 1951, stopped accepting waste in 1958, and permanently closed in 1959. Due to current elevated landfill gas emissions at this site, LA County is proposing to install a gas collection system and carbon adsorbers. This system will be used to capture gas and reduce the landfill gas emissions from this site. The proposed equipment is considered the best available control technology to control landfill gas emissions for this project.

South Coast AQMD is holding this meeting in response to public comments. The meeting will provide the community with an opportunity to learn more about the operation and emissions associated with the proposed equipment and to ask questions related to the proposed permit.
