

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# Eastern Coachella Valley (ECV) Outreach Plan

#### I. Introduction

On June 4, 2021 the ECV Community Emissions Reduction Plan (CERP) was adopted by the South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) Governing Board and later approved by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) Governing Board on September 9, 2021. Included in the CERP are a series of strategies and actions based on Community Steering Committee (CSC) input at CSC meetings from February 2020 through May 2021. The CERP includes Actions, such as developing and enforcing regulations, providing incentives to accelerate the adoption of cleaner technologies, and conducting outreach to provide useful information to support the public in making informed choices. Additionally, air monitoring efforts will provide critical information to help guide investigations, provide public information, and track progress. Collaborative efforts with other agencies, organizations, businesses and other stakeholders will amplify the impact of these actions. Many of the actions will only be conducted during the implementation timeframe of this plan; however, there are also many actions (such as regulations, ongoing enforcement activities and certain incentive programs) that will be continuing activities conducted by the South Coast AQMD. A Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) was also developed to complement the air quality priorities and actions outlined in the CERP.

This Outreach Plan aims to identify community outreach, engagement, and communications through a community-led process, encouraging CSC members and their represented organizations to communicate the CSC's work to connect with the general ECV community. This plan will also highlight opportunities for the public to engage on CSC-related projects and CERP/CAMP implementation. A timeline is included suggesting milestone dates of completion. Through the CERP Implementation process, staff collaborates with CSC members seeking their active involvement and participation. Additionally, CSC members provided a listing of community councils, community task forces and other community spaces to invite to special CSC meetings for CERP updates.

The use of technology has helped close the gap and provided greater access to the ECV community during the CSC CERP development process. Through the use of Zoom video, telephone, call-in lines, emails, chats, e-flyers, dedicated website, etc., public engagement technology allowed for improved participation and language communication (Spanish) within the community. These tools will also be used during the development of this outreach plan.

#### Purpose of Community Outreach:

- As described in the CERP outreach efforts by community organizations should support work on the CERP tasks for the Salton Sea, reducing exposure to open burning, and reducing illegal dumping.
- As described in the AB617 ECV Charter CSC members were expected to, "demonstrate leadership by providing updates and outreach to their local community members", and work with the SCAQMD in this effort

#### CSC Members further added that outreach options and methods:


- Can/should include door-to-door outreach, Spanish radio, focus groups, interest surveys (distributed by CSC members) to determine community interests, social media, etc.
- Should be adjusted for lack of usual community events due to social distancing and COVID e.g., SunLine Transit can volunteer a
  mobile outreach vehicle which they have found to be effective during COVID.
- Can make use of informational ads placed on SunLine Transit busses & bus shelter, to disseminate ideas.
- Should request assistance from other CSC members (e.g., members affiliated with the school board)

#### CSC Members further added that outreach planning should:

- Ensure that outreach information language is stated simply to avoid confusion, and it should explain basic information such as, "What is AB617?"
- Expand the description and information on the community profile as currently stated in the CERP to include demographic information and description of impacts
- Consider how feedback can be obtained from the community
- Ensure that communities that are or will be affected by the environmental impacts in the CERP are included in the outreach plan. For example, communities that are affected by illegal dumping should be included in the outreach plan.
- Identify groups that might be omitted such as Boys & Girls Club etc.
- Be designed to also gather local knowledge that is already in community regarding the issues in the CERP (in addition to distributing information to the same groups)
- Ensure that we retain the interest of the community over the 5-year period of the CERP, including providing feedback to the community to demonstrate that action is being taken and that their input is not being wasted



# VI. Methods of Outreach

Through breakout room discussions and report backs, the CSC strategized on various outreach methods in which CERP key messages can be delivered. The strategic communications encompass the plans, goals, practices, and tools - by which the CERP actions can be delivered in consistent messages to its key target audiences and partners.



# VII. Outreach Principles & Steps

The role of CSC members doing outreach will be to inform the community residents and businesses of the benefits the program can provide them, listen to their concerns, and keep them updated. The CSC members are not operating in the role of enforcers; however, we have a monitoring role to report air quality issues within the community. We are therefore a bridge within the community. The role of CSC members doing outreach will agencies and cities will be to find areas of "collective impact" where we can work together with them to improve air quality in the community. Toward that end we may attend their meetings, provide comments on their activities, and keep them informed of our progress. A general approach to build the outreach steps outlined in this plan is shown below:



In planning outreach the team will consider barriers to engagement (in Step 2 and 7) and develop ways to overcome those barriers including matters of :

- Budget
- Deadlines
- Hours team members have available to work on this effort
- Resources needs
- Available resources beyond team members
- Resource constraints/needs
- Knowledge/Information missing
- Technical needs/Document production needs

As the outreach material specific to the contacts is being created the CSC group will also determine:

- Who will lead Team?
- Who will verify that outreach is effective?
- How the progress schedule relates to the CERP?

The current schedule for the outreach effort in shown in the following figure. As these are the action being taken primarily by the CSC member, with the support of SCAQMD staff the schedule lags slightly behind the schedule shown in the CERP.
