





REQUIREMENTS OF AB 617



- One year from community selection (December 2019), CERP must be submitted and adopted by air district Board
- CERP must focus on specific air quality priorities and include:
 - Community Profile
 - Enforcement Plan
 - Strategies for Implementing Actions
 - Metrics
 - Targets

*CAMP supports the CERP



Launch

- Establish CSC, charter, meeting format, and community boundary
- Identify top air quality priorities

Develop

- Develop CERP and CAMP to address air quality priorities

Complete


- CAMP is finalized
- CERP is adopted by South Coast AQMD Board and approved by CARB Board

Implement

- Staff begins implementing CAMP and CERP
