



Q & A WORKSHOP – SALTON SEA



CSC input and suggestions

- Provide additional information, including:
 - Emissions estimates and air dispersion modeling for future years
 - Data from other sources (i.e., independent studies)
 - Comparative data for context/perspective (e.g., tonnage vs. percentage)
 - Detailed labels (i.e., "desert" vs. "playa")
- Conduct a screening assessment for selenium, algal toxins, and pesticides in the playa dust as one of the monitoring goals
- Pursue collaboration with:
 - o local agencies to mitigate pesticide run-off into the Sea
 - local health-care providers
- Include aerosolized Sea spray as another potential emission source to evaluate

Q & A WORKSHOP – PESTICIDES



CSC input and suggestions

- Determine whether pesticides used in ECV contain sulfur
 - If sulfur is identified, determine if it contributes to the H2S problem in the Salton Sea
- Acquire pesticide usage data from the Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR), including volume and frequency of application
- Emphasized the need for pesticide monitoring




Q & A WORKSHOP – FUGITIVE ROAD DUST



CSC input and suggestions

- Explain methodology used to calculate emissions from unpaved roads
- Identify where low-cost sensors can be co-located with regulatory monitors
- Provide additional information on fugitive road dust data (i.e., comparative data for context/perspective)
- Consider including a road paving "offset" program, where incentive funds may be utilized

- Contact additional ECV growers to be included in the discussion


