

CERPAND CAMP DEVELOPMENT – OVERVIEW

Launch

- Establish SELA:
 - CSC
 - Community boundary
 - Emissions study area
- Identify top air quality priorities

Development

- CSC meetings and workshops to focus on:
 - Actions and strategies to meet emission reduction goals and targets
 - Air monitoring goals and objectives
- Technical Advisory Group (TAG) meetings to focus on source attribution

Implementation


- CAMP is finalized by staff
- CERP is required to be:
 - Adopted by South
 Coast AQMD
 Governing Board
 - Approved by CARB Board
- CERP and CAMP are implemented



FINAL COMMUNITY BOUNDARY AND EMISSIONS STUDY AREA

Updates to Emissions Study Area

- Comment period (May 7 May 14)
 - One (1) comment received
 - Request to include metal processing facilities in area south of Century Blvd.
- Staff updated emissions study area to include facilities:
 - South of Century Blvd.
 - West of Capistrano Ave.
 - North Norton Ave.
 - East of Santa Fe Ave.

EXAMPLES OF ACTIONS AND STRATEGIES – GENERAL INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES

Enforcement



Conduct annual permit cross-checks for facilities

Outreach



- "Small Business Assistance" outreach to provide information about permit applications
 - Outreach and training on filing air quality complaints by phone, web, or mobile app

Air Monitoring



- Work with CSC to identify facilities and determine pollutants of interest
- Conduct air monitoring to support development and implementation of CERP
