



Green Space Project Plan Highlights

Funds planting droughttolerant, low-volatile organic compound (VOC) trees and projects encouraging more active forms of transportation

Preference given to green space projects which increase recreational opportunities

Requires maintenance of green spaces for 5 years

Incorporates CSC input received and gives preference to applications which addresses that feedback







The Community Emission Reductions Plan (CERP) provides a blueprint for achieving air pollution emission and exposure reductions to address this community's highest air quality priorities. This plan includes actions to reduce emissions and/or exposures in partnership with community stakeholders. Beginning in 2021, the plan will be implemented over several years, during which South Coast AQMD staff will track its progress and provide periodic updates to the community.

- Who can apply?
 - California community-based non-profit organizations
 - California Native American Tribes
- What can you apply for (project categories)?
 - Educational projects \$100,000 maximum per project
 - Technical or Targeted projects \$500,000 maximum per project
- Public engagement process starting late Spring 2024


