Statistics for May/June 2009

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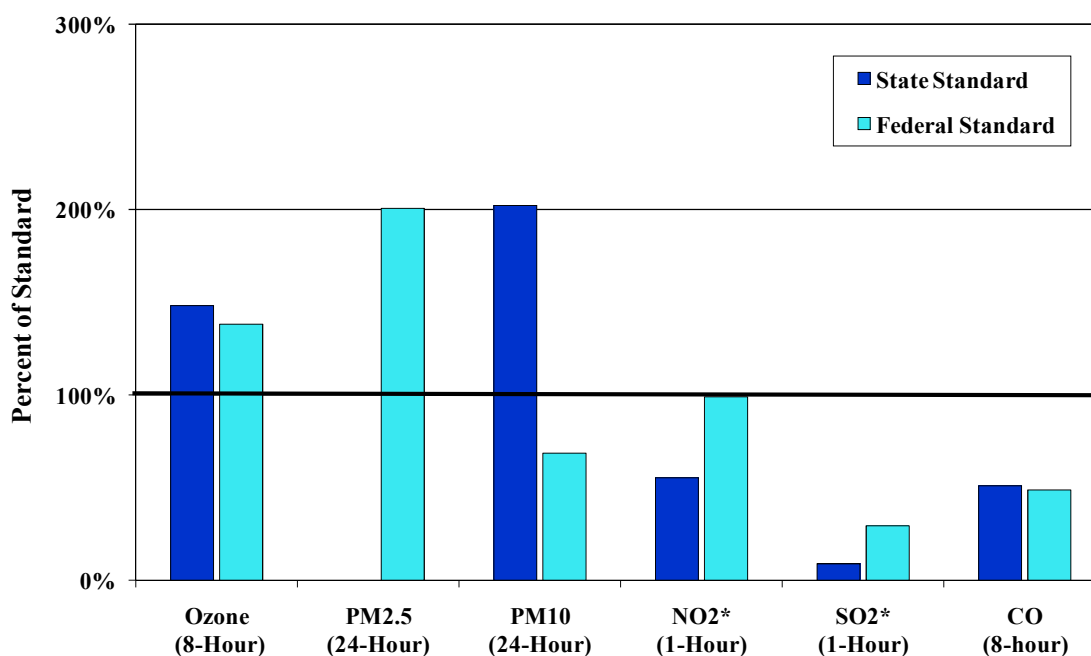
Air quality statistics for the South Coast Air Basin and the desert area of Coachella Valley in the Salton Sea Air Basin for the months of May and June are shown and summarized in the following tables.

Figure 1 (below) shows the 2009 year-to-date maximum pollutants concentrations in the District (Basin and Coachella Valley) as percent of the current state and federal standards. Figure 2 shows the location of the District's air monitoring stations in each source/receptor area. Tables 1 and 2 summarize monthly air quality statistics for the South Coast Air Basin and the desert area of Coachella Valley monitoring areas during the months of May and June 2009. The tables show maximum concentrations of the pollutants in each source/receptor area and number of days on which the locations monitored exceeded federal and/or state standards.

This bimonthly publication satisfies the requirements for reporting on air quality in the South Coast Air Basin set by California legislation (Chapter 1301, Statutes of 1987; Health and Safety Code Section 40451(d)), and supplies similar information for the areas of the Salton Sea Air Basin (Coachella Valley) served by the District.

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For information on the current state and federal ambient air quality standards please refer to the Table 1 of the January/February 2009 issue of the AQSCR.

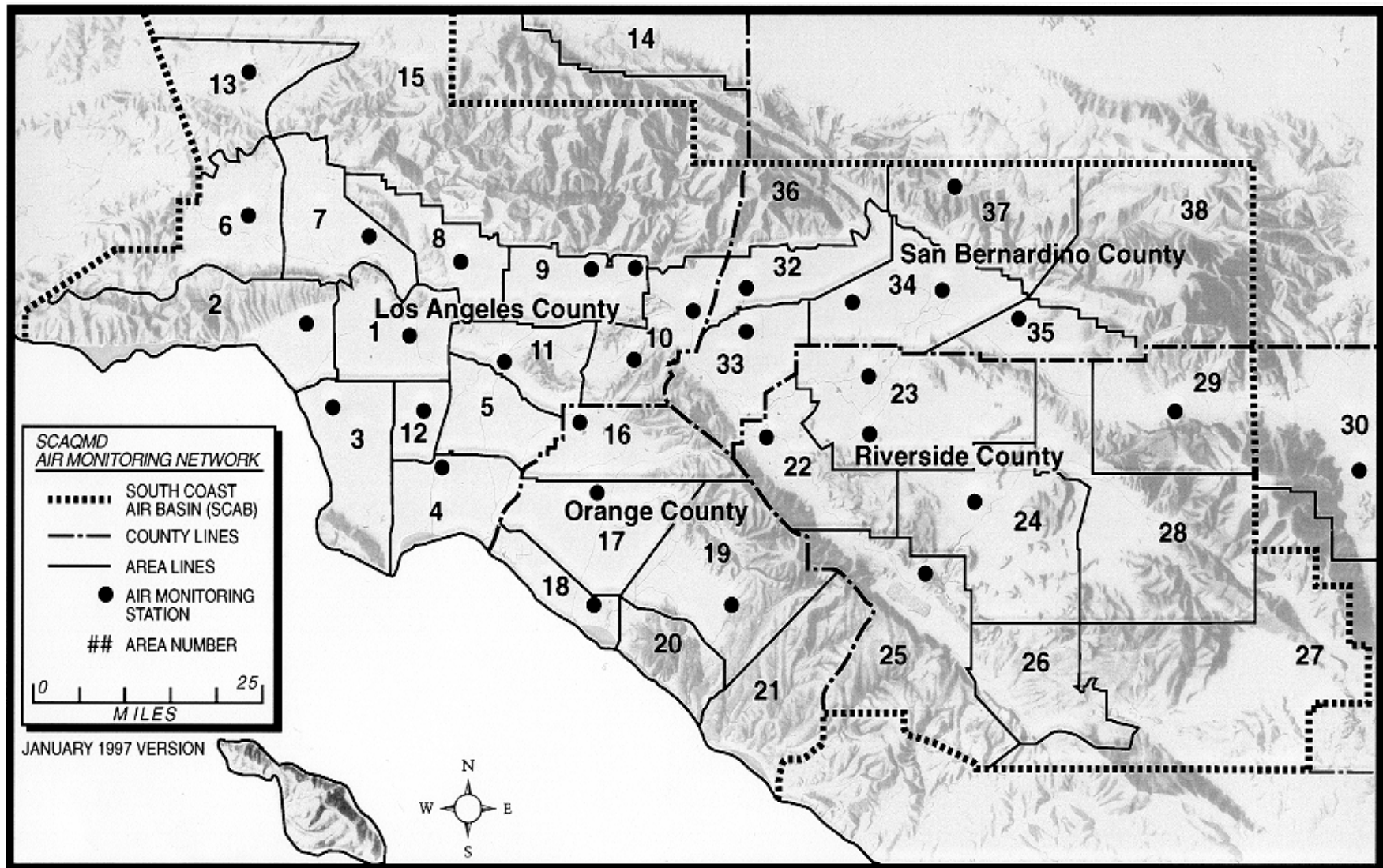
