Project Description: The Tesoro Refining and Marketing Company LLC proposed revisions to the original project, the Los Angeles Refinery Integration and Compliance Project, which was previously analyzed in the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR), certified on May 12, 2017 and referred to herein as the May 2017 Final EIR. The original project evaluated in the May 2017 Final EIR was comprised of modifications necessary to more fully integrate the Tesoro Los Angeles Refinery – Carson and Wilmington Operations to form the Tesoro Los Angeles Refinery (Refinery). The Refinery includes: 1) the Wilmington Operations located at 2101 East Pacific Coast Highway in the Wilmington District of the City of Los Angeles; and 2) the Carson Operations, which is the former BP Carson Refinery located at 2350 East 223rd Street in the City of Carson. The original project is proposed to be revised by: 1) relocating the propane recovery project component from the Carson Operations Naphtha Isomerization Unit to the Carson Operations C3 Splitter Unit; 2) increasing the throughput of the Carson Operations Tank 35; 3) updating the toxic air contaminant (TAC) speciation for the six crude oil storage tanks at the Carson Crude Terminal with additional data; and 4) updating the construction schedule. The proposed revisions to the original project are for components that were approved in the May 2017 Final EIR, but South Coast AQMD permits to construct were not issued.

This is to advise that the South Coast AQMD, as the Lead Agency for the above-described project, as revised, has approved the project, has certified the October 2019 Addendum to the May 2017 Final EIR, and has made the following determinations:

1. The South Coast AQMD, as lead agency, has evaluated the potential for significant adverse environmental effects of the revisions to the original project pursuant to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
2. The South Coast AQMD has determined that the proposed revisions to the original project: 1) are minor technical changes and additions necessary to make the May 2017 Final EIR adequate; 2) meet all the conditions for the preparation of an addendum pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15164; 3) are not outside of the scope of the analyses already contained in the previously certified May 2017 Final


EIR; and 4) do not meet the conditions that would require the preparation of a subsequent EIR pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15162.

3. The proposed revisions to the original project: 1) do not create any new significant adverse environmental impacts or make existing significant adverse environmental impacts substantially worse; and 2) are not outside of the scope of the analyses already contained in the previously certified May 2017 Final EIR.
4. The South Coast AQMD has caused to be prepared and participated in the preparation of the October 2019 Addendum to the May 2017 Final EIR.
5. The mitigation measures that were made a condition of approval of the original project analyzed in the May 2017 Final EIR and the corresponding Mitigation, Monitoring, and Reporting Plan that was adopted at that time will remain in effect. No new or modified mitigation measures were made as a condition of the approval of this revised project.
6. Findings and a Statement of Overriding Considerations were made as a condition of approval of the original project analyzed in the May 2017 Final EIR since significant adverse impacts were identified that could not be mitigated to less than significant levels, and thus remain in effect as a condition of approval of this revised project.
7. The South Coast AQMD Executive Officer has reviewed and considered the October 2019 Addendum to the May 2017 Final EIR, the May 2017 Final EIR, the Mitigation, Monitoring, and Reporting Plan for the May 2017 Final EIR, the Findings for the May 2017 Final EIR, the Statement of Overriding Considerations for the May 2017 Final EIR, and supporting documentation prior to making a decision on the project.





Brief Project Description: The Tesoro Refining & Marketing Company LLC is proposing the Los Angeles Refinery Integration and Compliance Project. In June 2013, Tesoro purchased the adjacent BP West Coast Products LLC Carson Refinery which, as part of the proposed project, will be more fully integrated with the Tesoro Los Angeles Refinery – Wilmington Operations to form the Tesoro Los Angeles Refinery (Refinery). The Refinery includes: (1) the Wilmington Operations located at 2101 East Pacific Coast Highway in the Wilmington District of the City of Los Angeles; and (2) the Carson Operations, which is the former BP Carson Refinery located at 2350 East 223rd Street in the City of Carson.

In addition to further Refinery integration, the proposed project is designed to comply with the federally-mandated Tier 3 gasoline specifications and with State and local regulations mandating emission reductions. The Los Angeles Refinery Integration and Compliance Project is expected to substantially reduce greenhouse gas (GHG), sulfur oxides (SOx), nitrogen oxides (NOx), carbon monoxide (CO), and particulate matter (PM) emissions at the Refinery. This will be accomplished by reconfiguring the combined Refinery complex to enable shutting down the Fluid Catalytic Cracking Unit (FCCU) at the Wilmington Operations, by installing interconnecting pipelines, and by reconfiguring the combined Refinery complex to improve the gasoline to distillate production ratio from the integrated Refinery in order to expeditiously respond and adjust to ongoing changes in market demand for various types of petroleum products. Additionally, heat recovery will be optimized by installing new heat exchangers and modifying specified units to further minimize criteria pollutant and GHG emissions. All new and modified stationary sources with emission increases will be required to comply with Best Available Control Technology (BACT) requirements in South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) Rule 1303.

Air quality, noise, greenhouse gases, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology/water quality, solid/hazardous waste, and transportation/traffic, are the environmental areas that were evaluated in the Draft EIR for the proposed project. The analysis of impacts for construction and operation indicated that construction emissions for VOC and NOx are expected to remain significant regionally following mitigation. Concentrations of NO2 from construction activities are expected to cause a significant impact to local air quality and while the mitigation measures would reduce those impacts, the localized air quality impacts would remain significant. Hazards and hazardous material impacts generated by the proposed project are expected to remain


significant after mitigation. The Refinery is located on lists of California Department of Toxics Substances Control hazardous waste facilities per Government Code §65962.5. Traffic impacts during construction were found to be significant prior to mitigation and less than significant with the implementation of mitigation. The remainder of the impacts in the above listed areas (i.e., air quality during operation, GHGs, hydrology/water quality, noise, and solid/hazardous waste) were found to be less than significant. The NOP/IS concluded that the proposed project would not create significant adverse environmental impacts to the following areas: aesthetics, agricultural and forestry resources, biological resources, cultural resources, energy, geology and soils, land use and planning, mineral resources, population and housing, public services, and recreation.

Determination: Based on a review of the project as proposed, the Department of Fish and Wildlife has determined that for purposes of the assessment of CEQA filing fees (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (c)) the project has no effect on fish, wildlife or their habitat and the project as described does not require payment of a CEQA filing fee. This determination does not in any way imply that the project is exempt from CEQA and does not determine the significance of any potential project effects evaluated pursuant to CEQA.
