Mid-Year Progress Report on MOU Implementation

Purpose

- On December 2019, a MOU was entered by the South Coast AQMD and BUR Airport
- Provide an interim report concerning the progress on the MOU measures.

COVID-19 Impact

- Domestic and international travel decreased to unprecedented levels
- BUR passenger activity has dramatically dropped by 90% from last year's activity
- BUR has now consolidated operations to a single terminal, suspended shuttles to parking lots
- Revaluating capital plans and allocation of resources

BUR continues to implement MOU Measures and key Air Quality Improvement

Measure No.1 Ground Support Emissions Reduction Policy



Program Description

Requires all GSE operators operating at BUR to reduce NOx emissions to achieve a GSE fleet average composite emissions factor which is equal to or less than 1.66 horsepower-hour of nitrogen oxides (g/hp-h of NOx) by January 1, 2023, and 0.74 g/hp-h of NOx by January 1, 2031.

Progress To Date

- Updated BUR Rules and Regulations to include GSE Policy
- Updated its Non-Exclusive Licensing Agreements to require compliance
- Updating leases with GSE Operators to require compliance
 - FedEx Airlines, Atlantic Aviation, Master Airline Lease Agreements
- BUR will require each operator to provide annual GSE data
 - Ongoing communications with airlines regarding annual GSE inventory data requriements
- Establishing BUR online portal for data submittals

Measure No.2 Burbank Airport Shuttle Fleet Conversion



Program Description

- Convert 100% of airport-owned medium or heavy-fleet to vehicles to be certified at SULEV or cleaner standards by December 2023.
- Percent of electric vehicles in BUR's bus fleet will increase with the objective of 50% electric fleet by 2023, and 100% conversion by 2031.

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Progress To Date

Challenges due to COVID-19

- Unprecedent loss of passenger activities and anticipated revenues
- Forced to reassess and drastically shrink its operating budgets and capital investments
- Shuttle services to parking lots fully suspended as of April 2020

May 2020 Status

- Updating its internal purchasing policies for BUR Fleet
- Purchasing Unit exploring zero-emission options for light-duty trucks or mini-vans
- Shuttle Fleet BID will be renewed prior to 2023 with MOU requirements for electric bus fleet





Measure No. 3 – Clean Construction Policy

Program Description

 Achieve 100% compliance through the Clean Construction Policy and each contractor's fleet of construction vehicles and equipment achieving 90% Tier 4 Final and 10% Tier 4 Interim by 2023, and 100% Tier 4 final by 2031.

Since adoption of MOU

- Released 2 construction contracts for airfield pavement management
- Included procurements BID specifications for its Airfield Pavement Management Construction Contracts

<u>Measure No. 4 – Burbank Transportation Management Organization (BTMO)</u>

- Joined BTMO on February 2020 to reduce employee trips through increased employee rideshare, transit use and alternative modes
- Approved new professional services agreement with Steer Davis & Gleave, Inc.
 - Contract Service Provider for BTMO membership
 - Provide services that promote sustainable commuting to and from Airport





BUR will monitor the progress towards each Measure and Initiative

- Quarterly internal status reports
- Annual tabulations will be prepared internally

Annual reports shall be provided to SCAQMD

- Status of achieving Measures goals
- Corrective measures (if any)
- Progress on Initiatives
- Changes or updates to Measures or Initiatives
- Items that may not have been covered in the AQIP (if any)



BUR Commitment to Local Hire

The largest future BUR capital improvement project is the Terminal Replacement Program. This project has completed CEQA but is still under NEPA review. As part of that project, a Project Labor Agreement has been executed and includes a provision that 30% of the construction be performed by Area Residents.

As part of the PLA, BUR has committed to hiring and recruiting Tier 1 Areas, which include Burbank, Glendale, Pasadena, and adjacent portion of Los Angeles, and if not available, will recruit form Tier 2 Areas, which include Studio City, Valley Village, Valley Glen, Van Nuys, North Hollywood East and West, and Sun Valley.

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
