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21 Respondent Exide Technologies (“Exide”) files this Status Report in accordance with the
22 Order for Abatement issued in Case No. 3151-32. This Status Report covers the period from
23 January 1, 2016 through March 31, 2016 (“Update Period”), summarizing the work performed
24 during this Update Period.

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26 As described in detail in Tetra Tech’s weekly reports, Exide performed planned, non-
27 routine maintenance and other tasks requiring mitigation measures under the Dust Mitigation Plan
28 during this Update Period, including (i) installation of seismic restraints at monitoring locations;

1 (ii) repair work on facility pipeline and water pipes; (iii) installation of storm water manhole
2 sensor covers; (iv) removal of planter box soil; (v) scheduled cleaning of flood control channel;
3 (vi) removal of sediment from equalization tanks; (vii) replacement of components of water
4 treatment plant; and (viii) installation of a well box.
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6 Tetra Tech is the District’s third-party monitor. Exide received copies of the twelve Tetra
7 Tech weekly reports submitted during this Update Period related to dust mitigation measures for
8 the tasks described above. In each of the three reports, Tetra Tech confirmed that “mitigation
9 measures were observed to be implemented in full compliance with the previously approved
10 mitigation measures under the [Dust Mitigation Plan]. . . .”
