SCAQMD Issues Smoke Advisory for Fire Burning at Camp Pendleton

This advisory is in effect today, June 30, 2017 through Saturday morning, July 1, 2017. SCAQMD will issue an update if additional information becomes available.

A brush fire, named the Cristianitos Fire, is burning in San Diego County, at Camp Pendleton and into San Clemente. The burn area was estimated this morning to be 760 acres with 70 percent containment. Winds are from the south this morning, potentially bringing smoke mainly into Orange County although smoke production currently appears low. Smoke impacts in the South Coast Air Basin are expected to improve as the sea-breeze increases from the southwest by late morning. Air quality may reach **Unhealthy** levels in areas directly impacted by smoke.

Depending on fire conditions, areas of greatest direct smoke impacts and potentially **Unhealthy** air quality may include:

- The Capistrano Valley Area (Forecast Area 21);
- The Saddleback Valley Area (Forecast Area 19); and
- The Central Orange County Coastal Area (Forecast Area 20).

All individuals are urged to exercise caution and avoid unnecessary outdoor activities in any area directly impacted by smoke. This includes areas where residents can see or smell smoke.

In any area directly impacted by smoke: Everyone should avoid any vigorous outdoor or indoor exertion; people with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly, and children should remain indoors. Keep windows and doors closed or seek alternate shelter. Run your air conditioner if you have one and keep the fresh air intake closed and the filter clean to prevent bringing additional smoke inside. Avoid using a swamp cooler or whole-

house fan to prevent bringing additional smoke inside. To avoid worsening the health effects of wildfire smoke, don't use indoor or outdoor wood-burning appliances, including fireplaces.
