SCAQMD Issues Smoke Advisory for Fire Burning in the Santa Clarita Valley

This advisory is in effect through Monday morning. SCAQMD will issue an update if additional information becomes available.

A brush fire, named the Placerita Fire, is burning near the intersection of the 14 Freeway with Placerita Canyon Road in Santa Clarita. The burn area was estimated this evening to be 750 acres with 50 percent containment. Winds are expected to be from the south today, with smoke moving to the north into the High Desert. Air quality may reach **Unhealthy** levels in areas directly impacted by smoke.

Areas of direct smoke impacts in the South Coast Air Basin and **Unhealthy** air quality will likely include portions of the Santa Clarita Valley (Forecast Area 13).

In any area impacted by smoke: *Everyone should avoid any vigorous outdoor or indoor exertion; people with respiratory or heart disease, older adults, and children should remain indoors. Keep windows and doors closed or seek alternate shelter. Run your air conditioner if you have one and keep the fresh air intake closed and the filter clean to prevent bringing additional smoke inside. Avoid using a swamp cooler or whole-house fan to prevent bringing additional smoke inside. To avoid worsening the health effects of smoke, don't use indoor or outdoor wood-burning appliances, including fireplaces.*
