SCAQMD Continues Smoke Advisory for Fire Burning in the Aliso Canyon and Laguna Beach Area of Orange County

This advisory is in effect through Monday morning, June 4. SCAQMD will issue an update if additional information becomes available.

A brush fire, named the Aliso Fire, is burning in Orange County near Aliso Viejo and Laguna Beach. The burn area is currently reported to be approximated at 150 acres with ten percent containment. Light onshore winds are expected to continue through the afternoon and evening bringing smoke into southern Orange County. Air quality may reach **Unhealthy for Sensitive Group** levels or higher in areas directly impacted by smoke.

Areas of direct smoke impacts and Unhealthful air quality may include portions of:

- Orange County (Areas 19, 20, and 21)

All individuals are urged to exercise caution and avoid unnecessary outdoor activities in any area directly impacted by smoke. This includes areas where residents can see or smell smoke.

In any area impacted by smoke: Everyone should avoid any vigorous outdoor or indoor exertion; people with respiratory or heart disease, pregnant women, older adults, and children should remain indoors. Keep windows and doors closed or seek alternate shelter. Run your air conditioner if you have one and keep the fresh air intake closed and the filter clean to prevent bringing additional smoke inside. Avoid using a swamp cooler or whole-house fan to prevent bringing additional smoke inside. To avoid worsening the health effects of smoke, don't use indoor or outdoor wood-burning appliances, including fireplaces.
