



CLEANair Rebate Update

Important Notice to all Manufacturers, Distributors, Sellers, and Installers of Residential Natural-Gas-Fired, Fan-Type Central Furnaces and Full Electric Heat Pump Systems with Ducted Air Handlers

General rebate funds for the Full Electric Heat Pump System with Ducted Air Handler to be fully allocated by June 30th, 2021.

In response to strong demand, the CLEANair Furnace Rebate Program expects general rebate funds for the Full Electric Heat Pump System with Ducted Air Handler to be fully allocated by June 30th, 2021. Consumers in the South Coast AQMD district can still take advantage of the Ultra-Low NOx Weatherized Furnaces and Ultra Low NOx High Altitude Furnaces rebate opportunities. Available rebates are subject to funding availability on a first come, first served basis.

Heat pump rebates for zip codes identified as disadvantaged and low-income in accordance to SB 535 and AB 1550 will be accepted.

During the Governing Board Meeting held on September 4, 2020, South Coast AQMD staff committed to dedicate minimum of 25 percent of the total rebate funding for installations in disadvantaged and low-income communities identified under SB535 and AB1550, respectively. As a part of the commitment, rebates for full electric heat pump systems with ducted air handlers will still be available for residents within zip codes identified as disadvantaged and low-income in accordance to SB 535 and AB 1550. Available rebates are subject to funding availability on a first come, first served basis.
