

Proposed Amended Rule 1466 Control of Particulate Emissions from Soils with Toxic Air Contaminants

WORKING GROUP MEETING #2 SEPTEMBER 12, 2017

Background

- Adopted July 7, 2017
- During rule development, Stationary Source Committee recommended expanding the list of applicable toxic air contaminants to include pesticides, herbicides, other metals, and persistent bio-cumulative toxics
- In the adoption Resolution, the Governing Board directed staff to expand the list of toxic air contaminants to include pesticides, herbicides, other metals, persistent bio-cumulative toxics, and semi-volatile organic compounds as early as practicable



Working Group #1

- August 3, 2017
- Staff presented two options for expanding the list of applicable toxic air contaminants
 - Option 1 All Rule 1401 and CARB Toxic Air Contaminants
 - Include all compounds in Rule 1401 Table 1 and CARB Toxic Air Contaminant Identification List
 - Option 2 Specific Toxic Air Contaminants
 - Include specific toxic air contaminants

Stakeholder comments

- Stakeholder suggested Option 2 with additional PAHs for sites designated by other agencies and Option 1 for sites designated by the Executive Officer
- Stakeholders commented that cobalt and manganese are not common contaminants of concern
- Stakeholders requested to have an exemption for linear trenching for water projects

Recommendation for Applicable TACs

US EPA, DTSC, Water Board, and Other Agency Designated Sites

> Arsenic, Asbestos, Cadmium, Hexavalent Chromium, Lead, Mercury, Nickel, PCBs

Dioxins (Rule 1401 Table 1), Pesticides, and PAHs

SCAQMD Designated Sites

Arsenic, Asbestos, Cadmium, Hexavalent Chromium, Lead, Mercury, Nickel, PCBs Dioxins (Rule 1401 Table 1), Pesticides, and PAHs

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Any Rule 1401 or CARB Toxic Air Contaminants Not Identified

Recommendation for Applicable Toxic Air Contaminants for Sites Identified by Other Agencies

- For sites identified by the U.S. EPA, DTSC, Water Boards, and other regulatory agencies, expand the list to include
 - Dioxins
 - Rule 1401, Table 1
 - Pesticides
 - chlordane
 - dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane (DDT)
 - dichlorodiphenyldichloroethylene (DDE)
 - dichlorodiphenyldichloroethane (DDD)


- Polycyclic Aromatic Hydrocarbons (PAHs)
 - benzo[a]anthracene
 - benzo[a]pyrene
 - benzo[b]fluoranthene
 - benzo[k]fluoranthene
 - chrysene
 - dibenz[a,h]anthracene
 - indeno[1,2,3-c,d]pyrene

Recommendation for Applicable TACs for Executive Officer Designated Sites

• Applicable Toxic Air Contaminants

- For Executive Officer Designated Sites, expand the list to include
 - All compounds listed in Rule 1401, Table I
 - All compounds listed in CARB Toxic Air Contaminant List
- Prior to designating a site, SCAQMD will consult with other agencies and also consider other criteria set in Rule 1466





Applicability

- Concerns raised regarding sites designated by county or local agencies
 - Certified Unified Program Agencies (CUPAs), Public Health Offices, Fire Departments
- PAR 1466 proposes to expand applicability to include sites that have been designated as Hazardous Material Release Sites by a county, local, or state regulatory agency pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 25403

Recommendations for Notifications

- PAR 1466 proposes to include provisions for when notifications need to be updated
 - Earlier starting date
 - Later starting date
 - Change in PM₁₀ monitoring location
 - Change in applicable toxic air contaminants
 - Change in volume of soil with applicable toxic air contaminants
 - Change in completion date
- Clarifies notification provisions
- Consistent with Rule 403
