Purpose of this Meeting

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) has scheduled a Public Workshop for the purpose of soliciting information and suggestions from the public and stakeholders regarding Proposed Rule 461.1 – Gasoline Transfer and Dispensing for Mobile Fueling Operations (PR 461.1), Proposed Amended Rule 461 – Gasoline Transfer and Dispensing (PAR 461), PAR 219 – Equipment Not Requiring a Written Permit Pursuant to Regulation II (PAR 219), and PAR 222 – Filing Requirements for Specific Emission Sources Not Requiring a Written Permit Pursuant to Regulation II (PAR 222). PR 461.1, PAR 461, PAR 219, and PAR 222 are scheduled to be considered for adoption at a Public Hearing before the South Coast AQMD Governing Board on January 7, 2022.

Proposed Rule 461.1 Background and Objective

Staff determined there to be regulatory gap in existing Rule 461 that has allowed mobile fuelers to dispense gasoline without controlling gasoline vapor emissions either because the existing rule did not apply, based on the mobile fueler's cumulative capacity, or because the mobile fueler is dispensing into non-motor vehicles. PR 461.1 seeks to address this gap. Mobile fueling has been regulated by the South Coast AQMD and has included requiring Phase II vapor recovery on mobile fuelers that dispense into motor vehicles since 1995. The industry has evolved since then and now includes mobile fuelers who serve different customers, including private vehicles that are not part of fleets.

PR 461.1 is designed to reduce VOC and toxic air contaminant emissions from mobile fuelers that dispense gasoline. PR 461.1 is applicable to mobile fuelers that dispense gasoline into non-motor vehicles and establishes performance standards for the control of gasoline vapor emissions during gasoline transfer and dispensing. PR 461.1 requirements include implementing CARB certified control technologies as well as requirements for operation, inspection, repair, testing, and recordkeeping.

Proposed Amended Rule 219, 222, and 461, and Proposed Rule 461.1 Background and Objectives

The objective of PAR 219 and PAR 222 is to revise the permitting exemptions for retail and non-retail mobile fuelers. PR 461.1 seeks to maintain existing performance standards for the control of gasoline vapor emissions in a rule dedicated to mobile fuelers. PAR 461 will therefore remove provisions addressing mobile fuelers. PAR 461 will also address outdated definitions and provisions.

California Environmental Quality Act

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and South Coast AQMD's certified regulatory program (Public Resources Code Section 21080.5, CEQA Guidelines Section 15251(l) and

South Coast AQMD Rule 110), the South Coast AQMD, as lead agency, is reviewing the proposed project to determine if it will result in any potential adverse environmental impacts.
