- ***Who and How is the Project funded?***

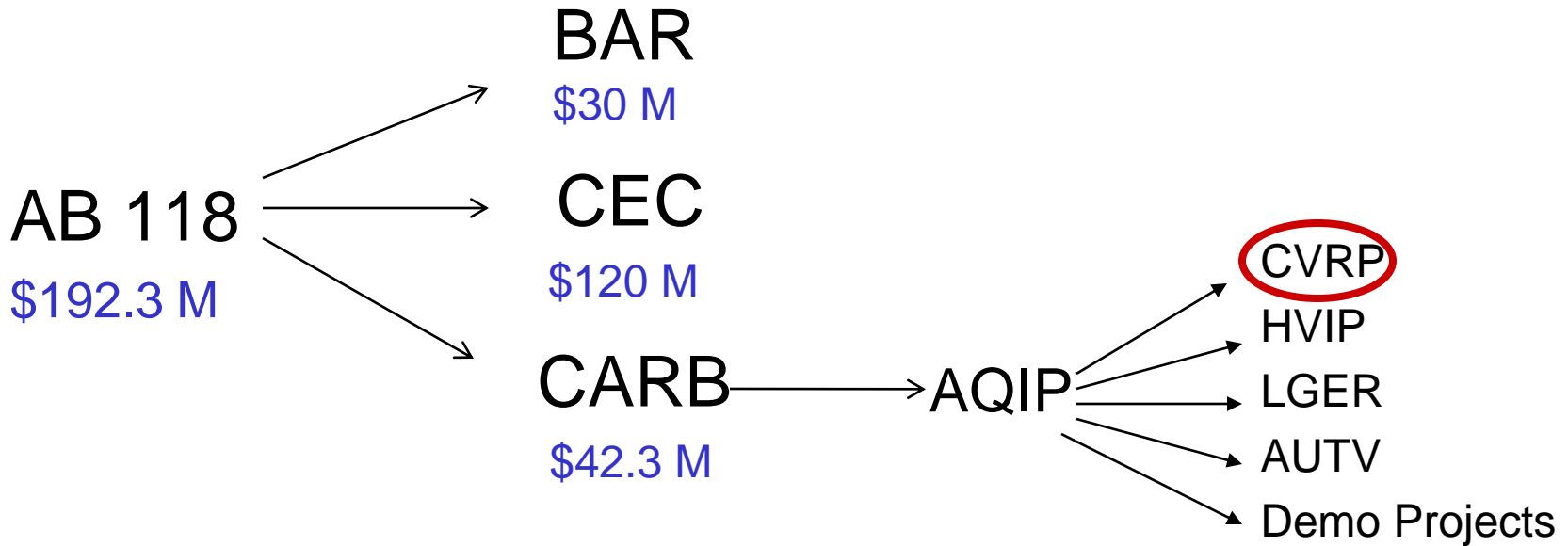
- California Air Resources Board via Increases in Fees:

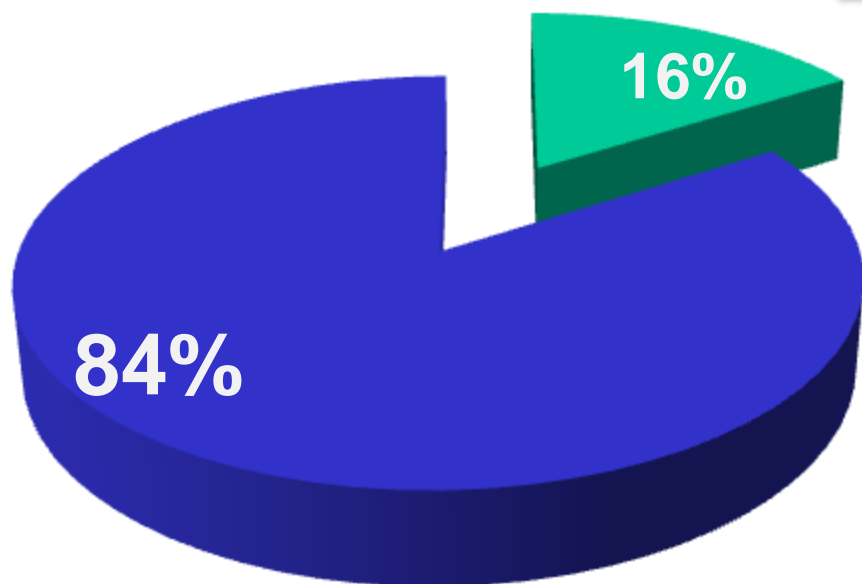

Who is Eligible?

1

Individual, business, nonprofit or government entity **based in California** or **has a California based affiliate**

2

Purchase or Lease a **NEW** Zero-Emission Vehicle (ZEV) or Plug-In Hybrid Electric Vehicle (PHEV)

3

Vehicle must be purchased **AFTER** March 15, 2010

4

MUST own/lease the vehicle for a **MINIMUM of 36 CONSECUTIVE MONTHS**

5

MUST be registered with the California DMV for a **MINIMUM of 36 CONSECUTIVE MONTHS**

What Vehicles are Eligible?



Commercial Zero Emission Vehicles

- \$20,000



Light Duty Zero Emission Vehicles

- \$3,000-\$5,000



Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicles

- \$3,000 (expected 2012)



Neighborhood Electric Vehicles

- \$1,000-\$1,500



Zero Emissions Motorcycles

- \$1,500

Light Duty Zero Emission Vehicles

- ***Rebate amount based on two factors:***
 - Vehicle Range and Fast Refueling Capability
 - Vehicles categorized from Type I to Type V

Type I.5



Smart ED

- Eligible for \$4,000
- $\geq 75, < 100$ miles
- Fast refueling capability does not apply

Type II, III, IV and V



Nissan LEAF (II)

- All Eligible for \$5,000
- ≥ 100 miles
- Fast refueling dependent on vehicle type

How do I apply?

Step 1

- Go to www.energycenter.org/cvrp
- Select vehicle and fill out application

Step 2

- Email sent with applications and information
- Mail in supporting documents
 - Within 14 calendar days

Supporting Documents



Proof of temporary or permanent vehicle registration



Copy of the sales or lease contract signed by all parties
Itemized list of credits, discounts and incentives received



Individuals: Proof of California Residency including a **utility or cable bill** from within the last 3 MONTHS or a notarized rental agreement

NOTE A California driver license is not an acceptable proof of residency



Business/Nonprofits: Copy of formation document filed with the CA Secretary of State. Sole proprietors may submit a copy of a utility or cable bill from within the last 3 months, or a current vehicle DMV registration or notarized rental agreement.



California: Clean Vehicle Rebate Project
-\$1,000-\$20,000 depending on zero emissions
vehicle type

Bay Area Air Quality Management District
- \$5 million in EV infrastructure

San Joaquin Valley Remove II Program
-\$1,000-\$3,000 depending on vehicle
emissions

City of Riverside Alternative Fuels Rebate
- Up to \$2,000 depending on MPG

Are there additional incentives?

- ***Federal Vehicle Tax Credit***
 - Range from \$2,500 to \$7,500.
- To qualify:
 - Battery capacity of at least 4 kilowatt-hours
 - Additional \$417 of credit per kWh above 5 kWh
- ***Federal Infrastructure Tax Credit***
 - *Electric Vehicle charging stations*
 - *Homes*: 50% of costs up to a maximum of \$2000
 - *Businesses*: Up to \$50,000 per business site

CLEAN VEHICLE REBATE PROJECT™

The Clean Vehicle Rebate Project (CVRP) is funded by the California Environmental Protection Agency's Air Resources Board (ARB) and administered statewide by the California Center for Sustainable Energy (CCSE). A total of \$4.1 million was appropriated from the ARB's Air Quality Improvement Program for the Project in order to promote the production and use of zero-emission vehicles, including electric, plug-in hybrid electric, and fuel cell vehicles. The program was created from Assembly Bill 118 that was signed by Governor Schwarzenegger in October 2007 and that funds air quality improvement projects through 2015.

The Clean Vehicle Rebate Project benefits the citizens of California by providing immediate air

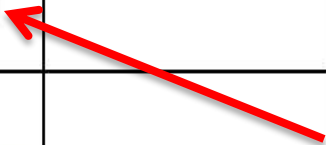

Clean Vehicle Rebate Project

Applicant Requirements and Qualifying Vehicle Information

Applicants must agree to meet all the requirements as specified in the [CURE Implementation Manual](#) as part of the rebate application. It is the responsibility of the applicant to review the [CURE Implementation Manual](#) prior to applying for a rebate.

Eligible Applicants must meet requirements that include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Be an individual, business, nonprofit or government entity that is based in California or has a California-based office as specified in Section 2.1 of the [CURE Implementation Manual](#).
2. Be a purchaser or lessee of a new Zero-Emission Vehicle ([ZEV](#)) or Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicle ([PHEV](#)) as specified in Sections 2.2 and 2.3 of the [CURE Implementation Manual](#).
3. Be a purchaser or lessee of a new eligible vehicle after the official start date of the Clean Vehicle Rebate Project, March 10, 2010, and prior to exhaustion of available rebate funds.
4. Retain ownership of the vehicle for a minimum of 30 consecutive months immediately after the vehicle purchase or lease date. Rebate recipients who do not retain the eligible vehicle for the full 30-month ownership or lease period will be required to reimburse [ARB](#) all or part of the original rebate amount.
5. Register the new vehicle with the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) for a minimum of 30 consecutive months for use in California. Any government-owned vehicle not registered with the California DMV is still required to operate within California for 30 consecutive months immediately after the vehicle purchase or lease date.

To qualify for a rebate, vehicles must meet the following requirements:

1. The vehicle must be new as defined in the California Vehicle Code (CVC) section 402 and must be manufactured by the Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) or its authorized licensee. Vehicles considered new vehicles solely for determination of compliance with state emissions standards are not eligible.
2. The vehicle must be on the List of Eligible Vehicles (available at [www.energycenter.org](#)) on the date of purchase or lease.
3. Zero-Emission Motorcycles ([ZEM](#)) and Neighborhood Electric Vehicles ([NEV](#)) must be equipped with sealed, maintenance-free batteries and meet the warranty requirements as described in Sections 2.3.2 and 2.3.4 of the [CURE Implementation Manual](#).

Rebates will be distributed on a strict first-come, first-served basis and issued to qualified recipients in a single allotment. Rebates will be issued no later than 60 days following receipt and verification of documentation.

Rebate funds will be immediately reserved by the Project Administrator upon receipt of a completed application. Required supporting documentation must be mailed within 14 calendar days (by U.S. mail postmark) after a completed application is received. If applicants do not submit the required documentation within that time frame, the funds will be released back to the project and a new application will need to be submitted.

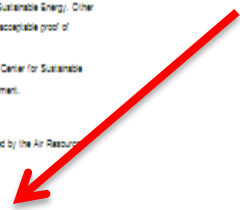
Required supporting documentation will include, at a minimum, the following:

- A printed copy of the submitted application signed by the vehicle purchaser, lessee or authorized representative.
- Proof of temporary or permanent vehicle registration.
- A copy of the sales or lease contract signed by all parties with itemization of credits, discounts and incentives received, if applicable.
- For individuals, a copy of a utility or cable bill from within the last 3 months or other valid proof of California residency as approved by the California Center for Sustainable Energy. Other forms of valid proof include a signed, dated and notarized rental agreement or a copy of a current vehicle DMV registration. A California driver license is not an acceptable proof of residency.
- For a business or nonprofit, a copy of the formation document filed with the California Secretary of State or other documentation as approved by the California Center for Sustainable Energy. Sole proprietors may submit a copy of a utility or cable bill from within the last 3 months, a current vehicle DMV registration or a notarized rental agreement.
- For [ZEM](#) and [NEV](#) as identified on the vehicle eligibility list, evidence of sealed maintenance-free batteries and a 34-month warranty.

Resale of a vehicle or return to a dealership is allowed within the required 30-month period if necessitated by unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances and as approved by the Air Resources Board. Rebate recipients who do not receive [ARB](#) approval for resales or returns will be required to reimburse the [ARB](#) all or part of the original rebate amount.

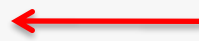
