Public School Air Filtration Program



Funding Now Available for Air Filtration Systems at Public Schools Within AB 617 Communities



Funding available to public schools for air filtration installation and maintenance projects



Air filters reduce exposure to particulate matter and other harmful pollutants



Up to \$13.7 million available



Up to 100% of cost covered



Eligible schools must be within an AB 617 community

Eligibility:

- ✓ Must be a public school
- ✓ Must be located within an AB 617 Community
- ✓ Must meet federal, state, and local requirements

Applicants must submit:

- ✓ A **project description**, including the number of classrooms, the number and type of filters requested, the use of subcontractors and other information
- ✓ A **project budget**, including the cost of installation, maintenance, and other factors contributing to the project cost
- ✓ A **project schedule** describing key milestones and completion dates
- ✓ **Other** submittal requirements detailed in the program announcement



Applications are due by December 20, 2024, by 3PM

- September 2024, the Board approved the AB 617 Public School Air Filtration Program
- The program provides up to \$13.7 million in CAP Incentive Funds for the installation and/or maintenance of HEPA filtration systems in public schools
- Staff conducted outreach to eligible school districts and vendors

- 469 schools applied for the program, including 115 schools in SELA
- Highest funding priority are public schools identified by the CSCs as listed at:
www.aqmd.gov/publicschoolaf
- Staff has completed all application evaluations and is finalizing contracts for vendors to install and maintain HEPA filtration systems

 - 1 Battery Electric Charging Station (\$8,076,569)
 - 1 Battery Electric Material Handler (\$134,536)
- Total Awards for 2026 - \$8.2 Million in Community Air Protection Program Incentives













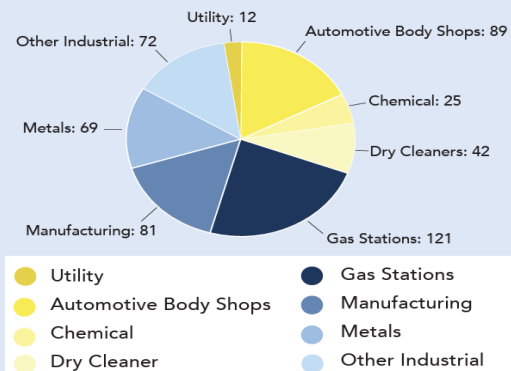


South Coast AQMD Inspections in Southeast Los Angeles (SELA)

South Coast AQMD routinely conducts on-site inspections and other field operations at general industrial facilities, including:

- Manufacturing Facilities
- Automotive Body Shops
- Gas Stations
- Dry Cleaners
- Metal Processing Facilities
- Chemical Plants
- Utilities

Facility types in the SELA Community



What Happens During an Inspection?

Inspectors evaluate compliance with air quality regulations, state laws (California Health and Safety Codes), and permit conditions. While each inspection is unique to a specific type of industry, they generally consist of three key components:

Pre-Inspection Activities

Prior to visiting facilities, the inspectors review relevant documentation, including air quality permits, compliance history, source tests, and other applicable information.

The Inspection

Inspectors observe equipment, operational processes, and housekeeping practices to evaluate compliance.

Closing Meeting

After the inspection, a meeting is held with facility representatives to discuss preliminary findings and next steps. Inspectors also document their findings in an inspection report.

Enforcement Action

Notices of Violation (NOV) are issued for violations of air quality rules and regulations. Notices to Comply (NOC) are issued for minor administrative violations. They are also issued to request records or information from a facility.

Settlement Agreement

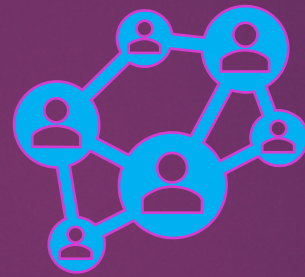
After an NOV is issued, a settlement agreement is negotiated which may result in civil penalties and/or voluntary actions to reduce emissions. If no settlement is reached, a civil lawsuit may be filed in the superior court.

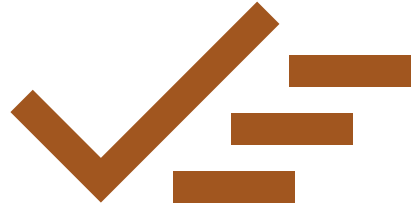
