#### **BACKGROUND**

This report summarizes the activities of the Legislative, Public Affairs and Media Office for September 2017. The report includes five major areas: Environmental Justice Update; Community Events/Public Meetings (including the Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, and Public Information Center); Business Assistance; Media Relations; and Outreach to Business and Governments.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE UPDATE

The following are key environmental justice-related activities in which staff participated during September 2017. These events involve communities which suffer disproportionately from adverse air quality impacts.

#### September 6

• Staff attended an open house sponsored by the Coalition for Clean Air. Staff networked with environmental justice leaders and others, and shared information on SCAQMD's environmental justice efforts including the Environmental Justice Community Partnership and the upcoming Environmental Justice Conference

scheduled for Saturday, December 2, 2017 at the Center at Cathedral Plaza in Los Angeles.

## September 7

• Staff attended the San Bernardino Valley Community College Diesel Advisory Task Force meeting. Staff provided information on the Carl Moyer program and other incentive programs.

## September 9

• Staff attended a meeting held by the City of Colton regarding fugitive dust issues. Staff provided information on compliance activities and on how to file an air quality complaint. There were approximately 45 people in attendance at the meeting.

## September 13

- Staff presented at the Mecca-North Shore Community Council meeting. The
  presentation included general information about SCAQMD, how to file an air
  quality complaint, and current programs.
- Staff attended the Long Beach Council District 9 neighborhood meeting, and provided information on the special air toxics investigations related to metalworking facilities and hexavalent chromium.

## September 20

• Staff participated in a tour of the Job Corps facility in San Bernardino. SCAQMD provided funding for commercial electric landscaping equipment and lawn mowers at the facility. The equipment is being used to train individuals in green landscape management.

## September 26

- Staff attended a web briefing by U.S. EPA's Office of Environmental Justice (OEJ). The briefing, for environmental justice stakeholders, focused on the agency's decision to transfer the OEJfrom the Office of Enforcement Compliance Assurance (OECA) to the Office of Policy (OP). Senior U.S. EPA officials briefed attendees on the change and answered questions.
- Staff organized and assisted with the public conference call to provide the Paramount community with updates related to the special air toxics investigation.

#### September 28

Staff attended the I-710 Project Committee meeting in Huntington Park. The
meeting was well attended by community groups who expressed frustration that
there was not a quorum of Committee Members present. Metro provided
information on the costs and potential funds for the various project build options as
well as sound wall concepts.

#### COMMUNITY EVENTS/PUBLIC MEETINGS

Each year SCAQMD staff engage with thousands of residents, providing valuable information about the agency, incentive programs and ways individuals can help reduce air pollution through events and meetings sponsored solely by SCAQMD or in partnership with others. #### SPEAKERS BUREAU/VISITOR SERVICES

SCAQMD regularly receives requests for staff to speak on air quality-related issues from a wide variety of organizations, such as trade associations, chambers of commerce, community-based groups, schools, hospitals and health-based organizations. SCAQMD also hosts visitors from around the world who meet with staff on a wide range of air quality issues.

#### **BUSINESS ASSISTANCE**

SCAQMD notifies local businesses of proposed regulations so they can participate in the agency's rule development process. SCAQMD also works with other agencies and governments to identify efficient, cost-effective ways to reduce air pollution and shares that information broadly. Staff provides personalized assistance to small businesses both over the telephone and via on-site consultation. The information is summarized below:

- Provided permit application assistance to 206 companies
- Provided assistance in filing 1 request for variance
- Conducted 5 free on-site consultations; and
- Issued 66 clearance letters.

#### MEDIA RELATIONS

The Media Office handles all SCAQMD outreach and communications with television, radio, newspapers and all other publications and media operations.

## **Major Media Topics for September**

- Methane emissions regulations for medium-and heavy-duty trucks. TruckingInfo.com inquired about recommended fleet practices to reduce methane emissions. Staff sent the reporter a response to her questions.
- Weather Patterns and Air Quality:
  - o **KPCC** requested information on whether recent rains may have improved local air quality. Staff responded that air quality improvement is likely after periods of rain.
  - o **KPCC and L.A. Times** submitted inquiries pertaining to air quality effects of the heat wave and local wildfire smoke. Staff participated in several interviews. Many stories ran in these and additional publications.
- Center for Public Integrity:
  - o **RECLAIM:** Specific topics of interest include the number of selective catalytic reduction devices which were expected to be installed at local refineries, but were not installed, as of December 2015.
  - o **Tesoro:** Regarding the use and output of Bakken crude and tar sands.
  - o **LARIC Project:** Requested a tally of EIR comments for and against the Los Angeles Refinery Integration and Compliance (LARIC) project.
  - o **Refineries:** Topics pertained to the estimated percentage of air pollution attributable to the Ports of L.A. and Long Beach, and what actions were required of the Tesoro Wilmington facility when its risk exceeds the threshold for public notification.
- **EPA:** Inside Washington Publishers (IWP) News inquired whether or not SCAQMD has been involved in, or aware of, U.S. EPA stakeholder meetings within the last eight months, or other correspondence the District may have had with U.S. EPA during this time.
- Catenary Truck Demonstration: Staff conducted an interview with Truck.com on status and scope of the demonstration project, the reason for project delays and potential for future commercialization of this technology.
- **Dr. Burke's Reappointment:** The Bakewell Company (L.A. Sentinel, Watts Times, requested a 750-word article from SCAQMD on the re-appointment of Dr. Burke.
- **Aliso Canyon:** HBO's Vice News interviewed staff to include in a report on the second anniversary of the Aliso Canyon gas leak, and proceeding recovery. Interview declined since the scope of our health study has not yet been determined.
- **Air Pollution Book:** Author Tim Smedley interviewed staff regarding his "major new book about air pollution," to be published by Bloomsbury Sigma.

- Seal Beach Odor Concerns: The Seal Beach Sun inquired regarding reports of intense odors in the area on September 18. Staff responded and provided photos of Tedlar bags and Summa canisters.
- Canyon Fire: KPCC, KABC, and KNX Radio requested interviews regarding the Canyon 1 Fire. Stories ran on September 27. KABC story aired twice the same day.
- **Sensor Conference:** A reporter from KPCC attended Day One of SCAQMD's Sensor Conference. Staff met with the reporter and facilitated interviews.

## Media Campaigns

• **Google Ad Campaign:** The 'Right to Breathe' Google Ad Word campaign garnered 13,399 clicks, 15.42 million impressions, and 1.92 million views.

#### • Check Before You Burn

- o Completed revisions to Omnibus survey questions to measure public awareness of the program. Approximately 400 surveys will be conducted by phone and internet during the first two weeks of October.
- Approved ad buys to reserve air time during the campaign on iHeartRadio and Spectrum cable systems.
- o Sponsored two fireplace replacements for "DIY Restored," which will air in January, with social media posts in October and January.
- o Received 646 pledges and 539 Air Alerts signups to-date from events such as "Green on the Green" and "Irvine Global Village" events.
- o The rough cut of the 30-second video has been approved, and will next go to professional voiceover.
- **Signature Film update:** Draft script received by contractor and shared with executive team members for feedback. After consideration of feedback received, staff will request an audio transcript and rough video cut from the contractor.

#### Website

- Presented a new template for website "Hot Topics" to Executive Council members. As new issues arise that require a microsite, use of this template will help users find the information they are looking for by having a consistent layout across all "Hot Topics."
- Reorganized the Paramount microsite using the new template to change from one very long, scrolling page into a more concise microsite home page with seven linking pages.
