



Who Controls the Air You Breathe?

- Different agencies work together to devise policies and strategies to clean the air
- Different countries also have different standards

Who Controls the Air You Breathe?

Federal – U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)

- Sets National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for six criteria pollutants
 - Carbon Monoxide
 - Lead
 - Nitrogen Dioxide
 - Ozone
 - Particle Pollution (PM10 and PM2.5)
- Clean Air Act protects public and environmental health



Who Controls the Air You Breathe?

State - California Air Resources Board (CARB)

- Regulate mobile sources, e.g. cars and trucks
- Oversee local air quality agencies
- Set state air quality standards



Who Controls the Air You Breathe?

Local – South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD)

- Regulate stationary sources, e.g. factories
- Develop plans to meet standards set by state and federal agencies
- Local air quality agency for all of Orange County and urban portions of Los Angeles, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties
