CARB Regulations

U.S. EPA Waivers and Authorizations

Permisos y Autorizaciones de EPA de EE.UU.

- After CARB adopts a regulation for an emissions standard for new motor vehicles, CARB requests a waiver or authorization from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) under the U.S. Clean Air Act.
- CARB generally does not enforce a regulation with a pending waiver or authorization request until the EPA approves the request or determines a waiver or authorization is not necessary.
- Después de que CARB adopta una regulación para un estándar de emisiones para vehículos motorizados nuevos, CARB solicita un permiso o autorización de la Agencia de Protección Ambiental de EE. UU. (EPA) bajo la Ley de Aire Limpio de EE. UU.
- Por lo general, CARB no hace cumplir una regulación con una solicitud de permiso o autorización pendiente hasta que EPA apruebe la solicitud o determine que no es necesario un permiso o autorización.

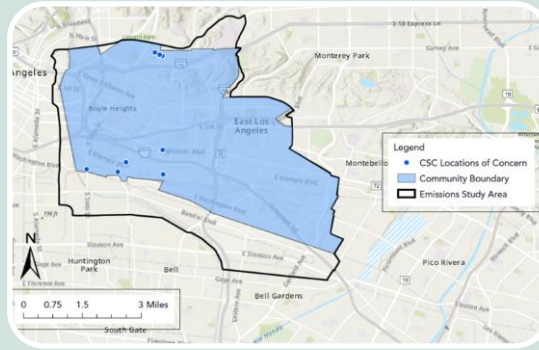

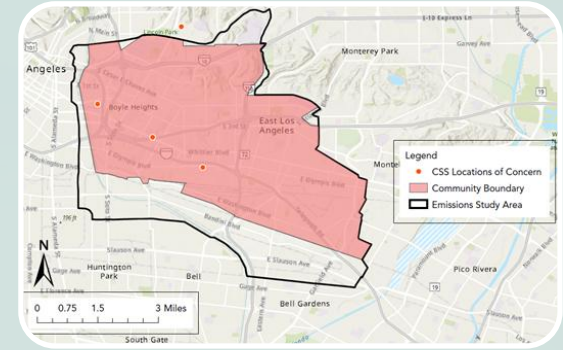

CERP No Idling Sign Commitment

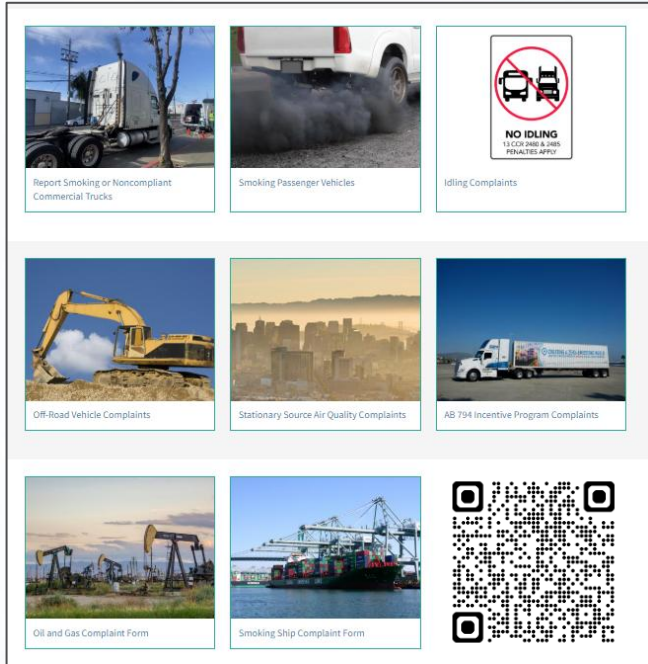

- ✓ A **project budget**, including the cost of installation, maintenance, and other factors contributing to the project cost
- ✓ A **project schedule** describing key milestones and completion dates
- ✓ **Other** submittal requirements detailed in the program announcement

- September 2024, the Board approved the AB 617 Public School Air Filtration Program
- The program provides up to \$13.7 million in CAP Incentive Funds for the installation and/or maintenance of HEPA filtration systems in public schools
- Staff conducted outreach to eligible school districts and vendors



- 469 schools applied for the program, including 82 schools in ELABHWC
- Highest funding priority are public schools identified by the CSCs as listed at:
www.aqmd.gov/publicschoolaf
- Staff has completed all application evaluations and is finalizing contracts for vendors to install and maintain HEPA filtration systems

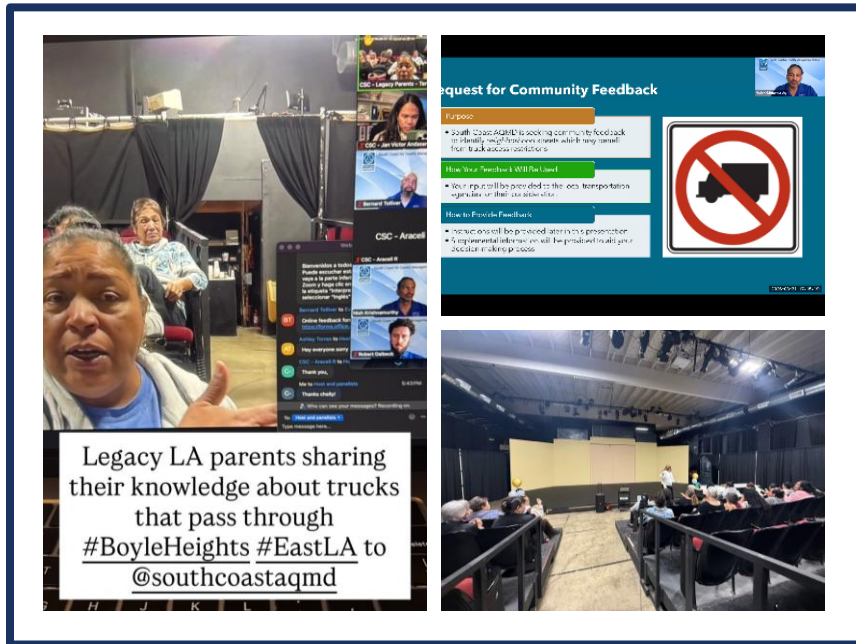
