




AB 617 RESIDENTIAL AIR FILTRATION PROJECT PLAN MEETING - MAY 26, 2022



BACKGROUND

- East Los Angeles, Boyle Heights, West Commerce Community (ELABHWC) CERP* includes an action to identify funding for residential air filtration systems in homes to reduce exposure to DPM
- In February 2021, the ELABHWC CSC allocated \$1.86M in CAPP funds toward residential air filtration systems
- In November 2021, the CSC prioritized a criteria-based approach to distribute air filtration systems based on proximity of homes to emission sources

- The purpose of the project plan is to demonstrate that funding criteria for residential air filters meet the Community Air Protection Incentives Guidelines
- The project plans include information such as:
 - Project identification
 - Participant requirements, and
 - Funding amounts
- CARB must approve all project plans




ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum requirements for eligible applicants:
 - Reside in the AB 617 ELABHWC Community,
 - Provide residence information (e.g., address and square footage occupied by the applicant),
 - Select a CARB certified cleaning device* or one approved for the program, and
 - Other administrative requirements
- Applicants may request up to three years of replacement filters

Funding Amounts for Home Air Filtration


Type of Equipment	Funding Amount
Standalone Air Filtration Unit	Up to 100%
Replacement Filters	Up to 100%





NEXT STEPS

- Summer, CARB approval (anticipated) of residential air filtration project plan
- Fall, seek Governing Board approval (anticipated) for the following:
 - Request for Proposal for qualified vendors to deliver units to residents, and
 - Program Announcement which includes program application and guidelines
- Winter, South Coast AQMD staff will:
 - Conduct community outreach,
 - Establish an application process for air filtration units,
 - Evaluate* and approve applications, and
 - Deliver units to residents
