Field Worker Safety

Definitions:

- "Treated field" means a field that has been treated with a pesticide or had a restricted entry interval or entry restricted period in effect within the last 30 days. A treated field includes associated roads, paths, ditches, borders, and headlands, if the pesticide was also directed to those areas. A treated field does not include areas inadvertently contaminated by drift or over spray.
- "Pesticide" means: (a) Any substance or mixture of substances that is a pesticide as defined in the Food and Agricultural Code and includes mixtures and dilutions of pesticides.
- "Pesticide Safety Information Series" means a series of leaflets that summarize health and safety aspects of various pesticides and groups of pesticides.

Who is a Fieldworker?

A **fieldworker** performs work-related cultural activities on an **agricultural establishment** such as harvesting, weeding, pruning, or irrigating for the production of commodities on farms, forests, and in nurseries or **enclosed space production** areas, such as greenhouses. See the glossary for the complete definition of who is a fieldworker.



Who is an Early-Entry Employee?

An early-entry employee is a worker who enters an area after the pesticide application is complete but before the Restricted Entry Interval (REI) has expired. Early-entry is only allowed under a narrow range of circumstances. Early-entry employees must receive personal protective equipment (PPE), decontamination supplies, and additional information about the pesticide product and the early-entry restrictions to protect themselves before entering the treated field.

Are There Age Restrictions for Certain Activities?



The California Pesticide Worker Safety Regulations require that agricultural and non-agricultural pesticide handlers and early-entry employees are at least 18 years old.

What are the Goals of the Pesticide Safety Regulations?

Pesticide safety regulations have three major goals.

1. Inform – to provide fieldworkers and pesticide handlers information to minimize occupational pesticide exposure for themselves and their families.
2. Protect – to protect fieldworkers and pesticide handlers from pesticide exposure while they are working.
3. Mitigate – to mitigate or reduce the effects of any pesticide exposure that might occur.

Goal 1 – Inform



Employers must provide fieldworkers and handlers with the pesticide safety and product use information needed to protect themselves, other people, and the environment from exposure to pesticides.

This is accomplished by providing:

- annual pesticide safety training,
- pesticide safety information at the **central location**,
- **application-specific information** and hazard information at the central location, and
- access to pesticide product labeling.

Goal 2 – Protect



The California Pesticide Worker Safety Regulations require employers to provide protections for fieldworkers and handlers to limit their risk of exposure to pesticides at work. These protections include:

- notifying employees when pesticide applications will take place
- informing employees verbally or by the posting of warning signs in pesticide-treated fields under an REI in which they should not enter
- maintaining and providing PPE for handlers and early-entry employees
- keeping employees who are not involved in the application of a pesticide out of application exclusion zones

Goal 3 – Mitigate




Pesticide safety regulations are intended to minimize the effect of potential pesticide exposure by requiring employers to provide:

- routine and emergency decontamination supplies,
- transportation to a nearby **medical facility** for a suspected pesticide illness or injury
- application-specific information for treating medical personnel in response to a case of pesticide exposure
- copies of the applicable **Safety Data Sheet(s)**
- the product name(s)
- U.S. Environmental Protection Agency registration number(s)
- **active ingredient(s)**
- the circumstances of application or use that could have resulted in exposure to the pesticide.

What is Pesticide Safety Training?

Employers must ensure that pesticide safety training is provided to fieldworkers **before** they enter a **treated field** or **area** where a pesticide has been applied or an REI has been in effect within the last 30 days. Handlers must be trained on the hazard and safety precautions before handling any pesticide product and retrained for any new pesticide products. Both trainings, must be completed every 12 months.





What are the Benefits of Pesticide Safety Training for Employees?

Fieldworkers and handlers benefit from pesticide safety training by receiving information on the potential risks of working in areas where pesticides have been used and **pesticide residues** may be found. During training, they learn how to protect themselves and their families from the possibility of exposure to pesticides and their residues.

- El sitio para la capacitación no debe tener distracciones, de manera razonable, y el instructor debe estar presente durante toda la presentación.
- Este documento debe ser guardado durante dos años, debe ser accesible al empleado y debe ser proporcionando al empleado, al Comisionado de Agricultura del Condado o al Departamento de Reglamentación del Pesticida a la solicitud.

Reglas de seguridad para el uso de pesticidas para los trabajadores agrícolas

Su capacitación y este folleto le informan de los peligros de los pesticidas en el trabajo. Los pesticidas son productos químicos que se usan para controlar plagas de insectos, maleza y enfermedades de las plantas. Si trabaja en una propiedad agrícola o en un bosque, invernadero o vivero, su empleador debe saber sobre los pesticidas que se usan y ayudarlo a aprender cómo protegerse.

LOS FERTILIZANTES NO SON PESTICIDAS.

ATENCIÓN MÉDICA DE EMERGENCIA

Su empleador debe tener planes para dar atención médica antes de que usted empiece a trabajar donde se han usado pesticidas. Usted o su supervisor deben ser informados de la ubicación del doctor. Si cree que los pesticidas hicieron que se enfermara o lastimara en el trabajo, avise a su empleador de inmediato. Deben asegurarse de que lo lleven al doctor inmediatamente. No maneje usted mismo al doctor si se enferma en el trabajo.

EMPLEADORES: Este es el folleto de comunicación de riesgo para sus trabajadores agrícolas. If you think you
have been
exposed...

- Pesticides can make you sick. Symptoms of pesticide poisoning can be the same as being stressed or ill from heat, having the flu, or other common illnesses. If you have a headache, dizziness, coughing, eye pain, blurred vision, burning eyes, an upset stomach, flu-like symptoms, or a rash while working in the field, ask your employer to take you to the doctor.

What Are Your Rights?

1. **Right to Know:** You have the right to know the following about pesticides that have been used recently where you work.
2. **Right to Worker's Compensation:** If you get sick or hurt BECAUSE OF YOUR JOB, you have the right to file for worker's compensation. Worker's compensation will pay for your medical bills, and sometimes, lost pay.
3. **Right to Access and Review Training Records:** You have the right to look at your safety training records from your employer.
4. **Right to Obtain Information:** You, your doctor, or your representative designated in writing can receive information from the grower or your employer. This includes which pesticides the fields were treated with or any other pesticide record the grower or your employer has to keep.
5. **Right to Report Unsafe Conditions:** Pesticide safety for workers is the top priority of the County Agricultural Commissioner and DPR. You have the right to report unsafe pesticide work conditions and suspected pesticide use violations without being punished or fired. Neither the grower nor your employer will be told who made the complaint. Your statements about the safety problems must be checked out right away.
6. **Right to Be Protected From Retaliation:** You are protected from being fired, from discrimination, and from any retaliatory action due to the exercise of any of your rights.





I. PM/Dust Characterization Study

ECV PM/DUST CHARACTERIZATION STUDY

- Air quality concerns in ECV include fugitive dust emissions from truck traffic, unpaved roads, the surrounding desert, agriculture, and the Salton Sea
- As part of CAMP implementation, we conducted a comprehensive study to address these concerns

Purpose:

- Identify main sources of PM/dust
- Quantify their contributions to particle pollution in the community



ECV PM/DUST CHARACTERIZATION STUDY

- The Mecca air monitoring station was supplemented with continuous monitors (ongoing) and samplers (Jan 2022 – May 2023)
- Real-time data is available online
- Preliminary findings will be discussed in the ECV Monitoring Working Team meetings to gather input in the coming months
 - 3 meetings before next CSC meeting







Identify opportunities to expand monitoring for H2S and PM10

Provide near real-time H2S data and real-time PM10 data

- Based on MWT discussions, an H2S monitor was added to Indio Air Monitoring Station
- An additional H2S monitor was deployed at North Shore
- New monitors are integrated into the subscription-based notification system that alerts subscribers when H2S exceed the state standard (30 ppb)
