AB 98 Phase II: Truck Routes in Unincorporated San Bernardino County

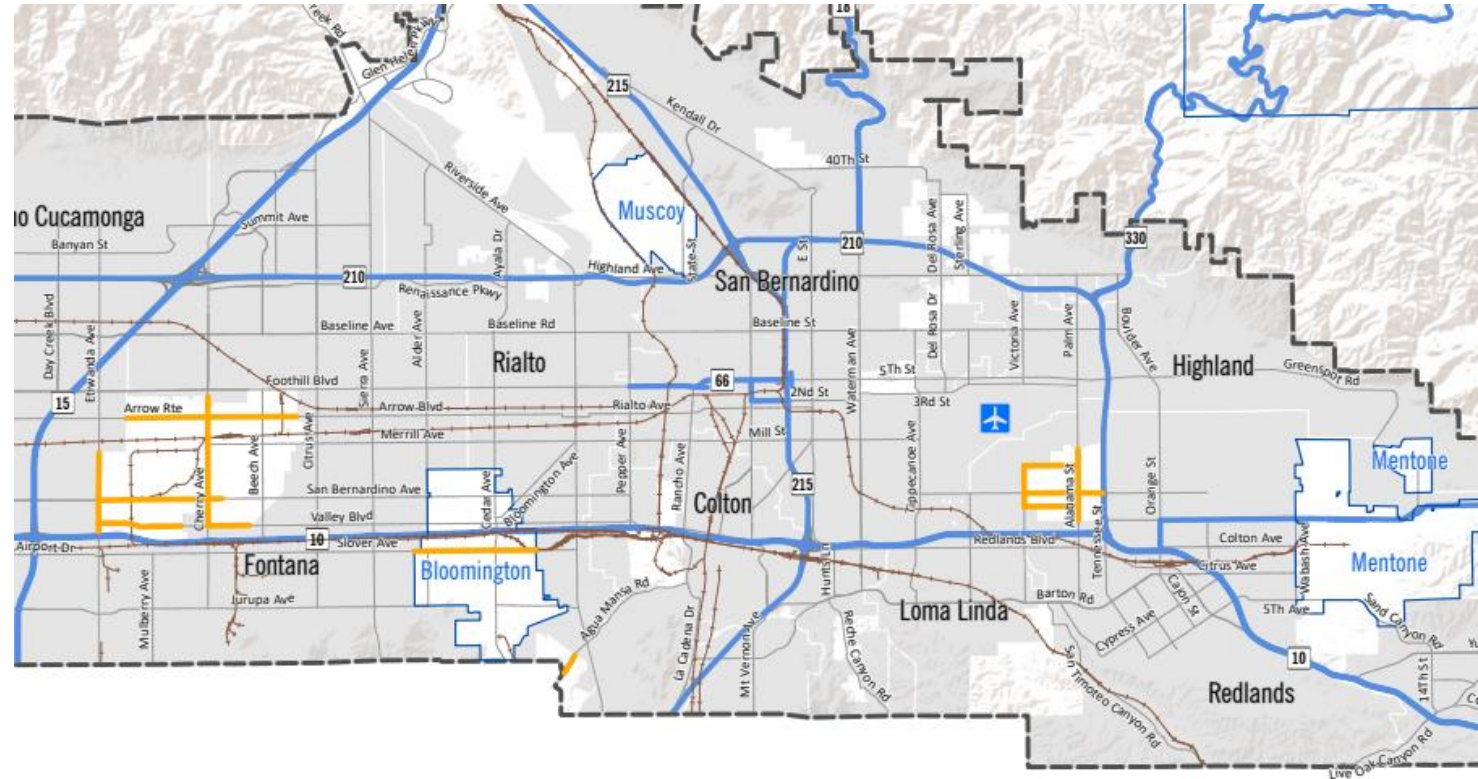


State law (Assembly Bill 98)

- Signed on September 29, 2024, it sets requirements for designated truck routes to improve goods movement and reduce impacts on sensitive receptors.

County requirements

- Adopt truck routes into the Transportation and Mobility Element of the Countywide Plan by January 1, 2026.
- Design routes to maximize use of major highways and minimize truck travel near sensitive receptors.
- Provide GIS route maps, signage, and opportunities for public input.
- County adopted routes on December 16, 2025.



Key Focus Areas

- Finalize signage program incorporating community feedback
- Expand public awareness and education about truck routes
- Continue gathering community feedback to guide implementation
- As needed refine designated truck routes based on updated analysis and community input

Milestones & Expected Outcomes

- Sign installation
- Weight-restricted roads and supporting infrastructure based on feedback
- Increase community and industry understanding regarding truck routes
- Continue coordination with regional and statewide partners

State

- CHP to improve enforcement of truck routes
- Caltrans for truck route consistency and data sharing

Regional/ Local

- SBCTA to support regional planning
- Local agencies to refine truck routes as needed

- CHP is responsible for enforcing:
 - Designated truck routes
 - Weight-restricted roads
 - Illegal parking or idling on public roadways

- Develop educational materials to support awareness for both the community and industry

- Draft plans available for Bloomington, Fontana SOI, Redlands East Valley Area
- Signage Installation and Timing
- Idling/ Idling Restrictions
- Consideration of time-of-day restrictions and physical roadway design changes

Truck Restrictions

- Limit vehicle access to light-duty vehicles (Classes 1-3) that weigh less than 16,000 pounds
- Exemption for public services like schools and trash pickup
- Roads identified for new truck restrictions in Implementation Plan include:
 - San Bernardino Avenue (from Live Oak Avenue to Elm Avenue) in unincorporated Fontana
 - Santa Ana Avenue (from roughly 600 feet east of Cedar Avenue to the Rialto city boundary) in Bloomington

Annual Evaluation

- Restricted roads will be reviewed annually by DPW based on public input.

- Code Enforcement actively addressing illegal truck parking
- Funding to expand current efforts that identify, notice, enforce, and successfully litigate illegal truck storage

- Launch [Social Pinpoint Survey Map](#) to collect community and industry feedback
- Complete truck route signage program and install across designated routes
- Follow-up meeting with community members and industry partners

Funding Now Available for Air Filtration Systems at Public Schools Within AB 617 Communities



Funding available to public schools for air filtration installation and maintenance projects



Air filters reduce exposure to particulate matter and other harmful pollutants



Up to \$13.7 million available



Up to 100% of cost covered

- ✓ A **project description**, including the number of classrooms, the number and type of filters requested, the use of subcontractors and other information
- ✓ A **project budget**, including the cost of installation, maintenance, and other factors contributing to the project cost
- ✓ A **project schedule** describing key milestones and completion dates
- ✓ **Other** submittal requirements detailed in the program announcement



Applications are due by **December 20, 2024, by 3PM**

- September 2024, the Board approved the AB 617 Public School Air Filtration Program
- The program provides up to \$13.7 million in CAP Incentive Funds for the installation and/or maintenance of HEPA filtration systems in public schools
- Staff conducted outreach to eligible school districts and vendors



- 469 schools applied for the program, including 28 schools in SBM
- Highest funding priority are public schools identified by the CSCs as listed at:
www.aqmd.gov/publicschoolaf
- Staff has completed all application evaluations and is finalizing contracts for vendors to install and maintain HEPA filtration systems

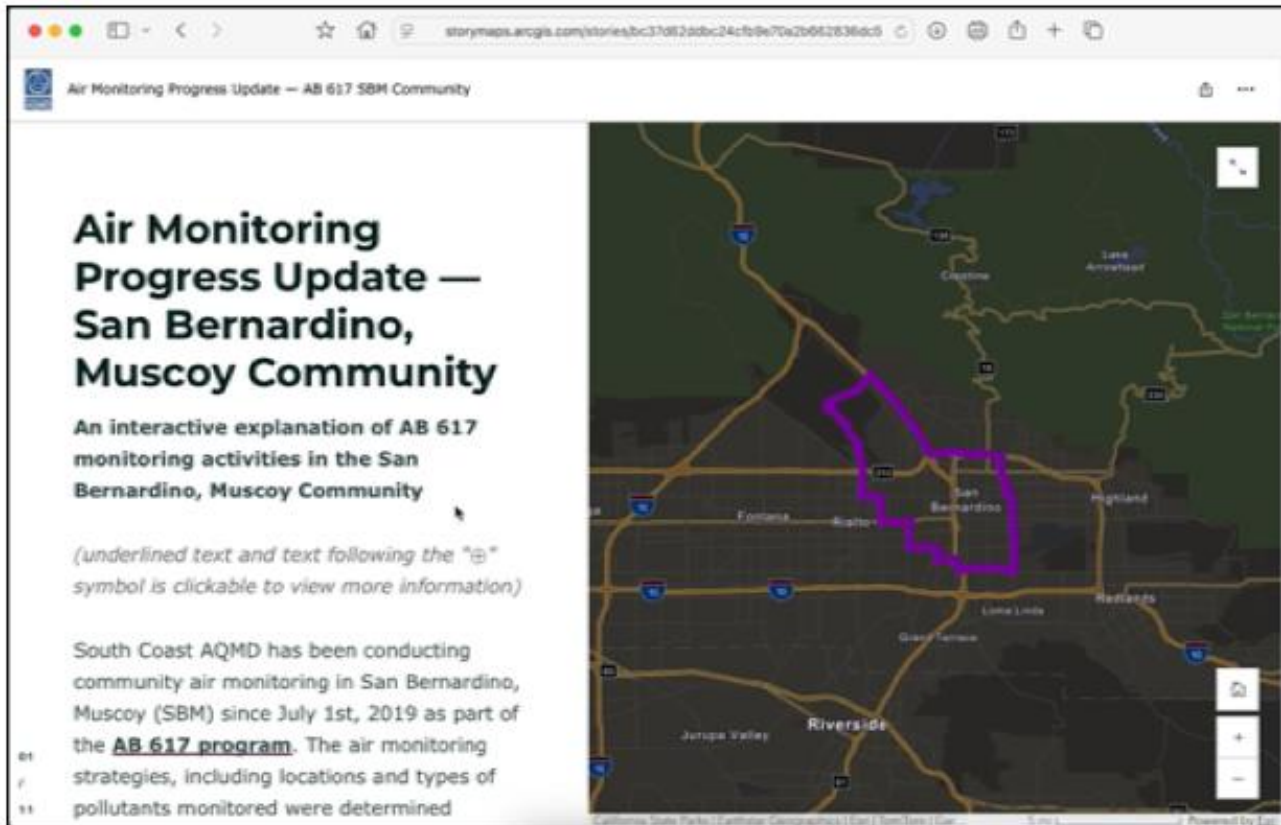


