

CERP AND CAMP DEVELOPMENT PROCESS AND TIMELINE

Launch

January – May 2021

- · Community meetings:
 - Virtual kick-off meeting
 - Air quality virtual joint conference
- CARB Board designates South LA for AB 617 program
- Establish community steering committee (CSC)
- Establish community boundary
- CSC identifies air quality priorities

Development

May 2021 - January 2022

- CSC develops CERP and CAMP including:
 - Emission reduction goals and targets
 - Actions and strategies

 (e.g., monitoring and incentive strategies) to achieve goals and targets
- CSC reviews and comments on CERP and CAMP
- Present draft CERP at committee meeting

Implementation

February 2022 - 2027

- CERP is adopted* by South Coast AQMD Governing Board
- Begin implementing CERP actions to reduce emissions
- Finalize CAMP and begin implementation
- Submit CERP to CARB for approval



* Health and Safety Code §44391.2(c)(2): CERP required to be adopted within one year of CARB's selection


COMMUNITY BOUNDARY

Purpose: to guide where AB 617 resources will be focused in this community

- Air measurements
- Incentives (e.g., funding for cleaner trucks)
- Emissions reductions

Goals

- · Identify the main impacted area*
- Identify the emissions study area** (Includes both the impacted area and nearby air pollution sources)
- * Neighborhoods outside the "impacted area" will benefit from reducing air pollution emissions near the boundary
- ** South Coast AQMD rules, enforcement, and other programs apply throughout our District


