Budget & Cap-and-Trade – AB 617 Funding

Fiscal Year 2025/26 State Budget

- **SB 105 (Weiner):** Signed into law by Governor Newsom - \$100 million statewide for AB 617 program for FY 2025-26. Includes:
 - \$45M for Implementation
 - \$50M for Community Incentives
 - \$5M for Community Grants

Cap-and-Trade Reauthorization

- **Two Key Bills – Reauthorized “Cap-and-Invest” Until 2045**
 - **SB 840 (Limon & McGuire):** \$250M continuous statewide annual funding for AB 617 Program through Cap-and-Invest
 - **AB 1207 (Irwin):** Reauthorized Cap-and-Invest until 2045
 - Provides long term, stable funding for AB 617 Program

Environmental Justice: Department of Justice: Bureau of Environmental Justice: Community Air Monitoring

SB 352 (Reyes): *Policy changes to AB 617 include:*

- If funding is available, requires AB 617 monitoring locations for at least 5 years with option for additional 5-year increments;
- Requires CARB to update monitoring plans every 5 years;
- Requires CARB, in consultation with air districts, to report annually to Legislature on AB 617 progress;
- Requires CARB Chair and local air districts to appear before Legislature upon request.

 - Provide update on CSC feedback on neighborhood streets and corridors that would benefit from truck access restrictions

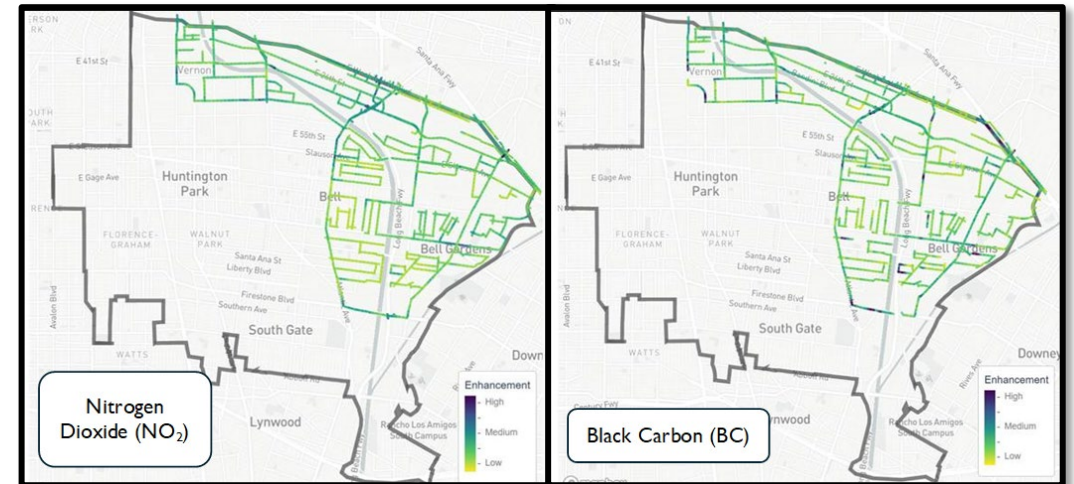

CSC Solicitation Summary

CSC feedback collected from March 18, 2025
– May 23, 2025

- Provided mobile air monitoring and truck traffic maps
- Three responses received resulting in 12 road segments
- Feedback focused on:
 - major thoroughfares which traverse the community
 - residential neighborhoods
 - industrial areas with heavy truck traffic

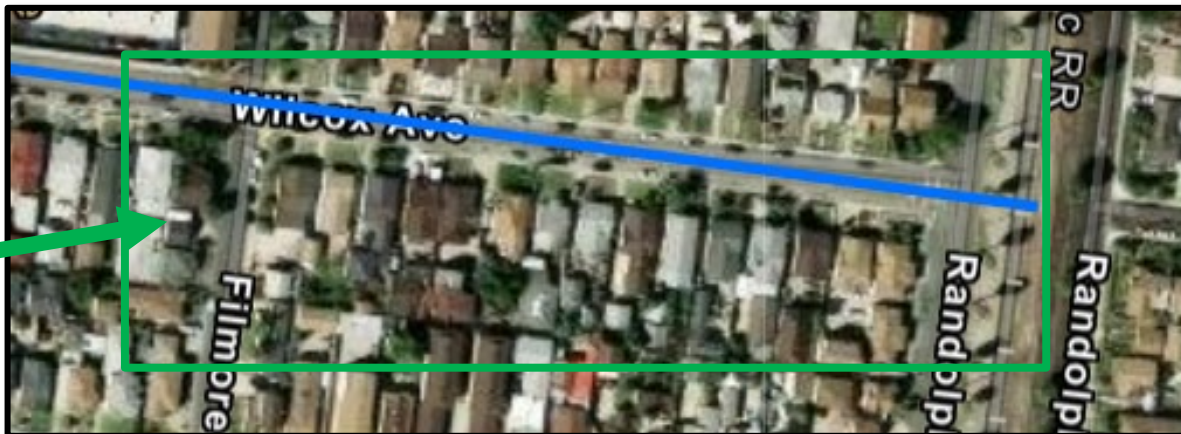

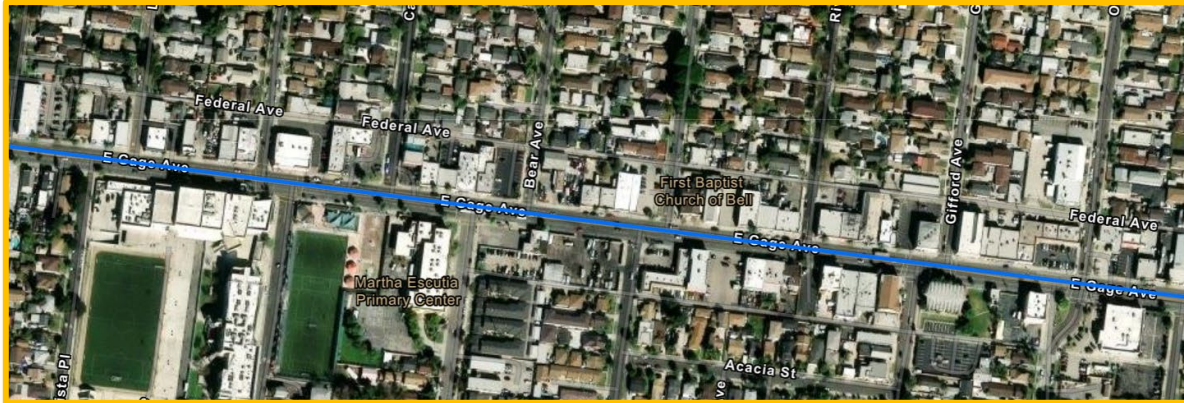

Restrictions which would impede access to commercial or industrial corridors

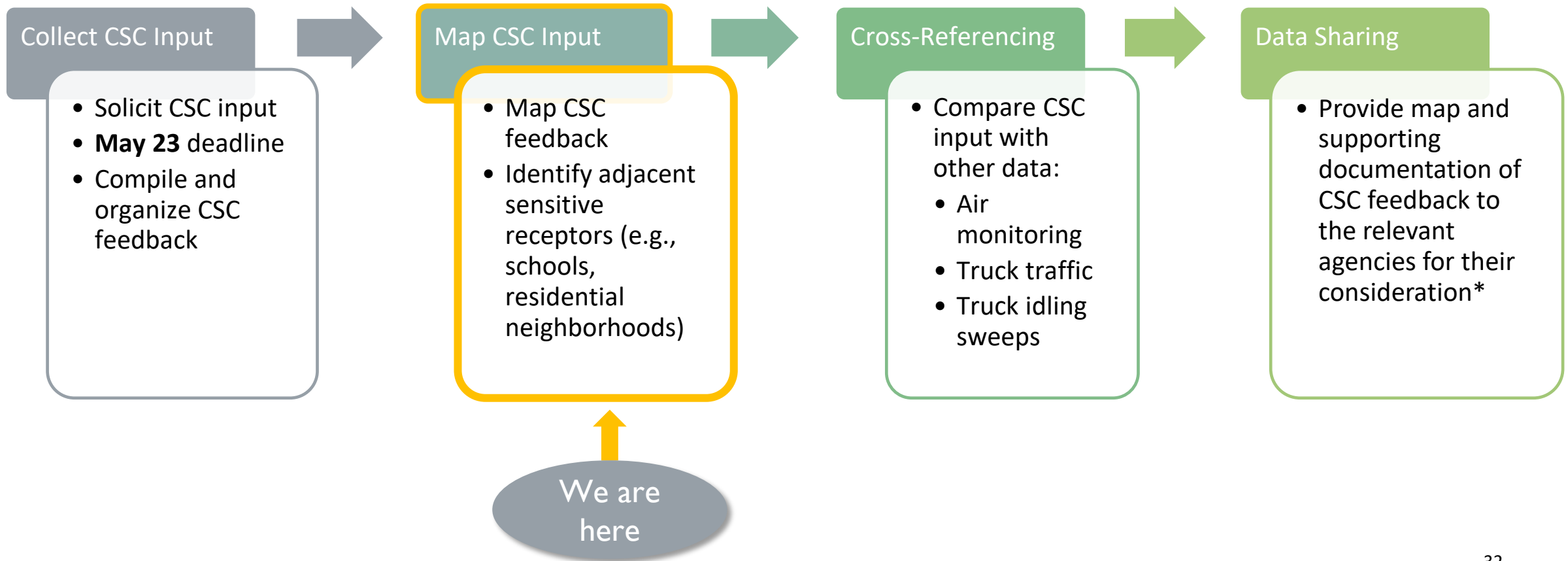
Existing truck routes

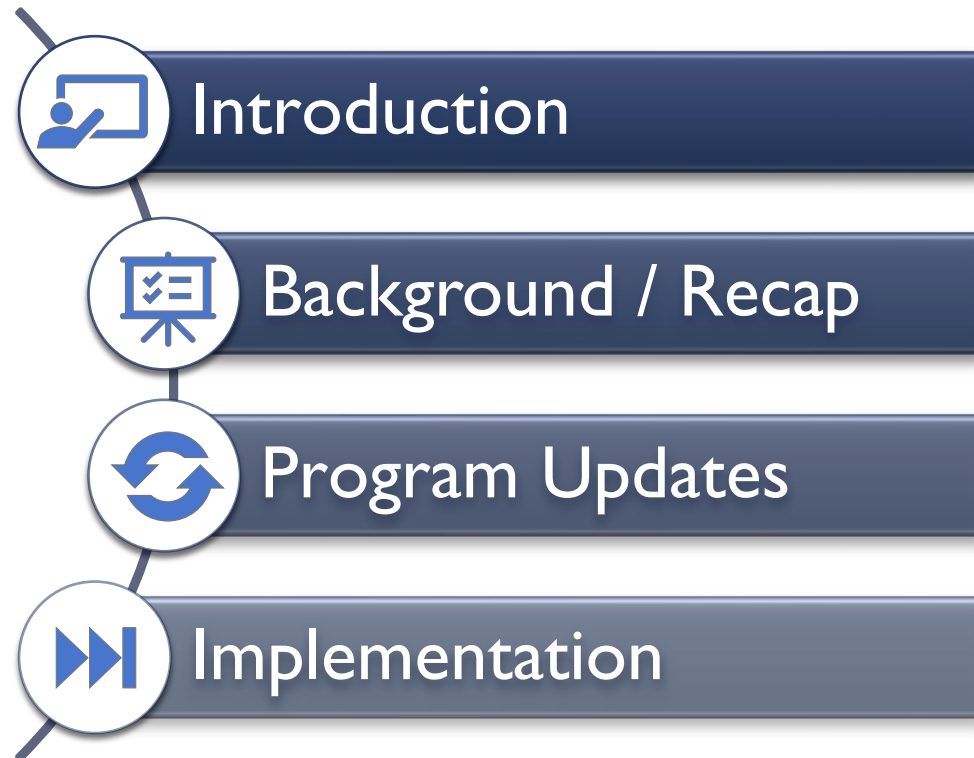

- Southeast Los Angeles Community Steering Committee allocated \$5M for Zero-Emission (ZE) trucks

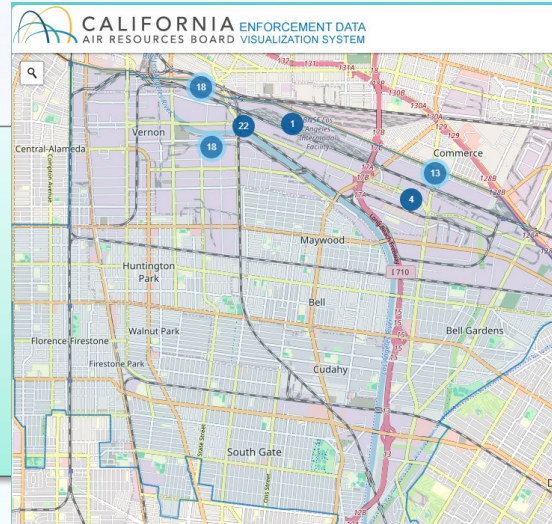

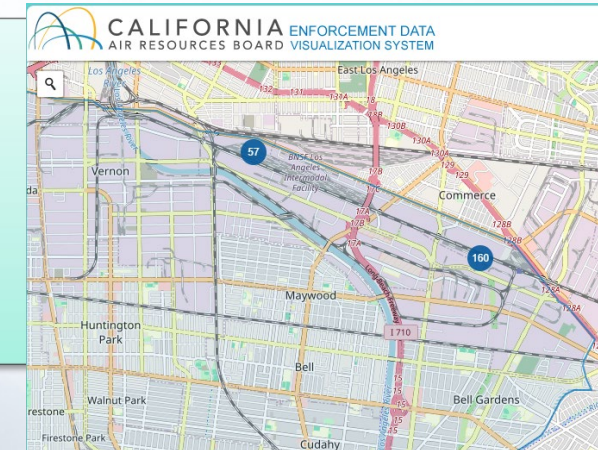

Idling Reduction Materials

Continue to distribute truck idling reduction materials during inspections

Diesel-fueled trucks and buses can idle for **up to 5 minutes**, and for longer if they are Clean Idle certified.



Trucks cannot idle for more than 5 minutes within 100 feet of **restricted areas**.



Homes



Schools



Hospitals



Care Facilities

Situations when idling is allowed:

- When stuck in traffic
- When queuing in line
- Using power take-off devices
- In emergency situations (e.g., adverse weather conditions or mechanical failures)
- During a truck inspection or servicing

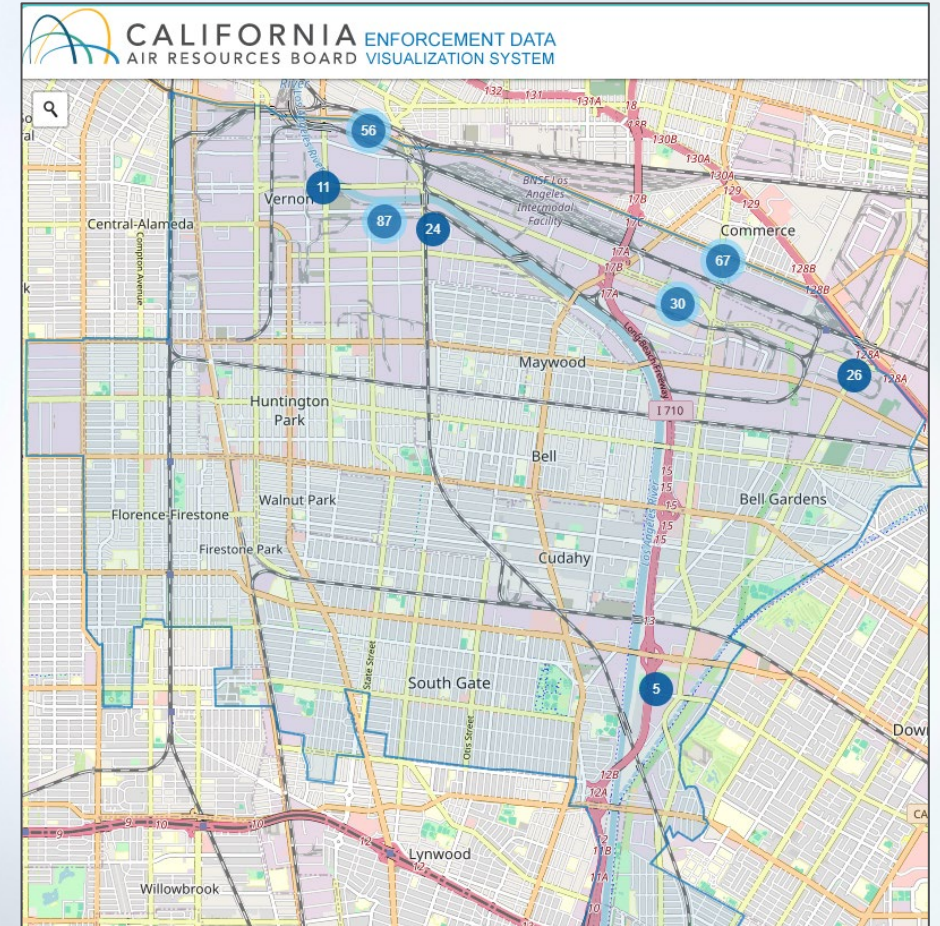

2024 Catalytic Converter Theft Deterrence Workgroup Update

Catalytic Converter Theft Deterrence

Communities throughout California, and the country, are facing a significant increase in catalytic converter theft. The National Insurance Crime Bureau tracked a four-fold increase in monthly thefts, and LAPD saw more than a 300 percent increase from 2019 to 2020.

Why are catalytic converters being stolen?

They contain valuable precious metals like palladium, platinum, and even rhodium, which can cost upwards of \$15,000 an ounce.

Why is it important to have a catalytic converter?

They reduce harmful emissions from vehicles to help meet clean air standards. Chemical reactions take place inside the catalytic converter to change unhealthy vehicle exhaust emissions into less harmful ones.



What do I do if my catalytic converter is stolen?

Call the police immediately instead of engaging a thief that is stealing your catalytic converter. If you notice it has been stolen, contact law enforcement and your insurance provider, and have a trusted mechanic inspect the other exhaust components for damage before replacing your vehicle's catalytic converter.

Potential deterrents

It only takes a thief a few minutes to steal a catalytic converter, and it can happen at any time of the day or night. The best deterrent is parking your car in a garage, if possible.

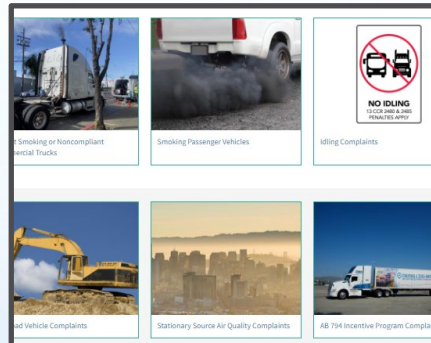

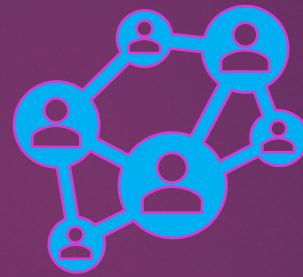

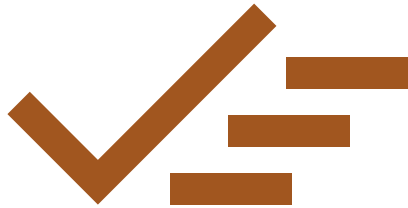
