





CURRENT APPROACH TO PR 2304 RULEMAKING


- Pursuing an incremental approach considering key feedback common to all stakeholders
- Starting with infrastructure planning <u>and</u> installation
 - Foundational to achieving future emission reductions
 - Leverage ongoing efforts and recent funding
- Initial preliminary draft rule language released on February 21
 - To be discussed at the February 28 working group meeting



No emission reduction requirements or cargo caps in current approach

Infrastructure Critical for Technologies Needed for Attainment

- Limited progress to date deploying non-diesel technologies at scale
- Charging/fueling infrastructure for alternative energies also has not yet been deployed at scale
- Energy infrastructure needed for:
 - Electricity
 - Hydrogen
 - Alternative marine fuels (e.g., methanol)





- Coordinated efforts to incentivize cleaner ocean-going vessels (OGV) on shared routes





OVERVIEW OF RULE 2306 – FREIGHT RAIL YARDS

- Adopted on August 2nd, 2024*
- Aimed to reduce NOx emissions from freight rail yards
 - Meet or exceed emission reduction targets at facility level
 - Working in conjunction with CARB regulations for locomotives and drayage trucks
 - Report on zero emission infrastructure development
- Becomes effective after U.S. EPA approvals of:
 - Authorization for CARB In-Use Locomotive Regulation
 - Waiver/authorization for CARB Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation
 - Inclusion of Rule 2306 into California State Implementation
 Plan



LATEST STATUS

Update on U.S. EPA Approvals

CARB withdrew the authorization and waiver requests to U.S. EPA for California's In-Use Locomotive* and Advance Clean Fleets** regulations on January 13th, 2025

Staff is currently evaluating impacts of CARB withdrawals and will provide an update to South Coast AQMD Governing Board's Mobile Source Committee



AIR MONITORING ACTIVITIES NEAR OIL WELLS

- Area wide mobile monitoring with enforcement team support
- Identify locations with enhanced Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) concentrations

Area Surveys

Source Identification

 Identification of emission sources through investigative monitoring

- Use Forward Looking InfraRed (FLIR) camera and Toxic Vapor Analyzers (TVA) to investigate for leaks
- Facilities fixed leaks (staff verified)

OIL WELLS AIR MONITORING TOOLBOX







Optical Remote Sensing Mobile Laboratory:

Used for surveys, hotspot identification, and/or concentration mapping of air toxic pollutants

Forward Looking Infrared Camera (FLIR):

Used to visualize emissions and field investigations


Toxic Vapor Analyzer:

Used to monitor for hydrocarbons and verify compliance and investigate complaints

RULES 1180 AND 1180.1 REFINERY AND COMMUNITY AIR MONITORING


Rule 1180 amended in January 2024

Amended to

- include facilities that are related to major petroleum refinery operations;
- additional monitoring for air toxic metals and particulate matter (PM);
- clarified other aspects for data reporting and monitoring systems audit

Rule 1180.1 adopted in January 2024


Applies to smaller refineries, e.g., asphalt plants and refineries that process alternative feedstocks (biofuels)






