

MATES IV Modeled Air Toxics Risks Estimates using OEHHA Updated Method

MATES IV:

70% lower DPM than MATES III

Ports area saw a 66% decrease in risk

MATES IV:

diesel exhaust is 68% of air toxics risk

"highest risk from air toxics surrounding the port areas"

"areas near the ports and near transportation corridors continue to show the highest air toxics risk"
