### **Background**

This report summarizes the activities of the Legislative, Public Affairs and Media Office for October 2025. The report includes Major Events, Community Events/Public Meetings, Environmental Justice (EJ) Update, Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, Public Information Center, Small Business Assistance, Media Relations, and Outreach to Community Groups and Governments.

### **Major Events (Hosted and Sponsored)**

Each year, staff engage in hosting and sponsoring several major events throughout South Coast AQMD's four-county jurisdiction to promote, educate, and provide important information to the public regarding reducing air pollution, protecting public health, and improving air quality while minimizing economic impacts.

### Working with Communities

On October 11, over 15 South Coast AQMD staff members volunteered with San Gabriel Valley Habitat for Humanity to help rehabilitate a home for a family in need in the El Sereno community of Los Angeles.

### Your Life is Now

On October 13, South Coast AQMD sponsored California Safe Schools' Your Life is Now and hosted a resource booth for about 300 attendees, sharing information on GO ZERO, INVEST CLEAN, how to file an air quality complaint, and the South Coast AQMD Mobile App.

### San Fernando Valley Classic

On October 18, South Coast AQMD sponsored the Friends of the Coliseum's San Fernando Valley Classic and hosted a resource booth to share information on GO ZERO, INVEST CLEAN, RYR, Commercial and Residential electric Lawn & Garden (eL&G) Programs, how to file an air quality complaint, and the Mobile App.

### Taste of Soul

On October 18, South Coast AQMD sponsored the Los Angeles Sentinel's 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Taste of Soul 2025 Family Festival to provide a resource booth for approximately 300,000 attendees to share information on GO ZERO, INVEST CLEAN, Commercial and Residential eL&G Programs, and how to file an air quality complaint. Staff demonstrated how to use the Mobile App with an interactive display and showcased electric lawn and garden equipment.

### **Environmental Justice Update**

  - ABC, KCAL/CBS and KNX: Staff participated in live interviews to provide updates on air quality following the incident.
