### **Background**

This report summarizes the activities of the Legislative, Public Affairs and Media Office for February 2026. The report includes Major Events, Community Events/Public Meetings, Environmental Justice (EJ) Update, Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, Public Information Center, Small Business Assistance, Media Relations, and Outreach to Community Groups and Governments.

### **Major Events (Hosted and Sponsored)**

Each year, staff engage in hosting and sponsoring several major events throughout South Coast AQMD's four-county jurisdiction to promote, educate, and provide important information to the public regarding reducing air pollution, protecting public health, and improving air quality while minimizing economic impacts.

### Working With Communities

On February 28, South Coast AQMD hosted a Working with Communities volunteer service project in partnership with Greater Los Angeles Habitat for Humanity to help build eight new environmentally sustainable townhomes in Long Beach.

### **Community Events/Public Meetings**

Staff engaged with residents and stakeholders of diverse communities to provide information about the agency, incentive programs, and ways individuals can help reduce air pollution through events and meetings sponsored by South Coast AQMD or in partnership with others. Attendees typically receive information regarding the following:

- Tips on reducing their exposure to smog and its negative health effects;
- How to file an air quality complaint;
- Clean air technologies and their deployment;
- Invitations to or notices of conferences, seminars, workshops, and other public events;
- South Coast AQMD incentive programs;
- Funding/grant opportunities by South Coast AQMD and partner agencies;
- Ways to participate in South Coast AQMD's rules and policy development; and
- Assistance in resolving air pollution-related problems.

### South Bay Association of Chambers of Commerce

On February 3, staff participated in the South Bay Association of Chambers of Commerce Government Affairs Committee to share information regarding the Zero-Emission Space and Water Heating Appliances (GO ZERO).

### **Environmental Justice Update**

The following are key EJ-related activities in which staff participated during February. These events and meetings involve communities affected disproportionately from adverse air quality impacts.

#### La Sierra High School, Orangewood High School, Walnut Park Middle School, and Environmental Charter High School

On February 3, staff visited La Sierra High School (Riverside), Orangewood High School (Redlands), Walnut Park Middle School (Walnut Park), and Environmental Charter High School (Gardena) to provide information on the Why Healthy Air Matters (WHAM) program, wildfire safety, Mobile App, and how to file an air quality complaint.

#### Katella High School, The Webb School, and El Modena High School

On February 10, staff visited Katella High School (Anaheim), The Webb School (Claremont), and El Modena High School (Orange) to provide information regarding the WHAM program, wildfire safety, Mobile App, and how to file an air quality complaint.

Los Angeles Unified School District

On February 10, staff met with Los Angeles Unified School District to provide information regarding the Clean Air Program for Elementary Students (CAPES) and WHAM programs. The discussion focused on how South Coast AQMD could work with LAUSD by providing the CAPES and WHAM curriculum.
