Background

This report summarizes the activities of the Legislative, Public Affairs and Media Office for May and June. The report includes Major Events, Community Events/Public Meetings, Environmental Justice (EJ) Update, Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, Public Information Center, Small Business Assistance, Media Relations, and Outreach to Community Groups and Governments.

Major Events (Hosted and Sponsored)

Each year, staff engage in hosting and sponsoring several major events throughout South Coast AQMD's four-county jurisdiction to promote, educate, and provide important information to the public regarding reducing air pollution, protecting public health, and improving air quality while minimizing economic impacts.

Southern California Association of Governments

On May 7, South Coast AQMD sponsored the 2026 Southern California Association of Governments Regional Conference and General Assembly, the largest gathering of elected and industry leaders in Southern California. South Coast AQMD's resource table featured information on our ELECTRIC and INVEST CLEAN programs to transition the freight sector to zero-emission technologies. Staff also provided information about South Coast AQMD, how to file an air quality complaint, and incentive programs for residents and businesses.

2026 Solutions Celebration

On June 4, South Coast AQMD sponsored the 2026 Solutions Celebration in San Pedro, hosted by Coalition for Clean Air. The event brought together industry leaders and community advocates to learn about California's zero-emission future. Staff hosted a resource table to highlight technology advancement projects that support the transition to zero-emission vehicles and equipment, including ELECTRIC and INVEST CLEAN. Staff also shared information about South Coast AQMD, how to file an air quality complaint, and the Mobile App.

2026 Leaders in Energy Summit

On June 4, South Coast AQMD sponsored the 2026 Leaders in Energy Summit, which brought together industry leaders, experts, innovators, and enthusiasts to explore the future of sustainable energy in the Inland Empire. Topics included workforce development, U.S Department of Energy initiatives, the future of hydrogen, power generation and microgrid development, and the use of drone technology. Staff hosted a resource booth to share information on INVEST CLEAN, ELECTRIC, Commercial and Residential Electric Lawn and Garden (eL&G) programs, Replace Your Ride (RYP), how to file an air quality complaint, and the Mobile App.

2026 General Assembly & Leadership Address

On June 18, South Coast AQMD sponsored the 35th Annual General Assembly & Leadership Address hosted by Western Riverside Council of Governments. Staff hosted a resource booth to share information on INVEST CLEAN, ELECTRIC, RYP, Residential EV Charging Program, Electric Lawn and Garden programs, wildfire preparedness, how to file an air quality complaint, and the Mobile App.

Community Events/Public Meetings

Staff engaged with residents and stakeholders of diverse communities to provide information about the agency, incentive programs, and ways individuals can help reduce air pollution through events and meetings sponsored by South Coast AQMD or in partnership with others. Environmental Justice Update

South Coast AQMD notifies local businesses of proposed regulations so they can participate in the agency's rule development process. South Coast AQMD works with other agencies and governments to identify efficient, cost-effective ways to reduce air pollution and shares that information broadly. Staff provided personalized assistance to small businesses over the telephone, at South Coast AQMD headquarters and via virtual on-site consultation, as summarized below for May and June.

- **Riverside County Air Quality:** Participated in an interview with NBC Palm Springs to discuss air quality in Riverside County, in relation to the American Lung Association's State of the Air report and dust pollution in the Coachella Valley.
