INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

1. Update on Proposed Amended Rule 1401 – New Source Review of Toxic Contaminants

Heather Farr, Planning and Rules Manager, Planning, Rule Development and Implementation, provided an overview of the proposed amendments to Rule 1401. For additional details, please refer to the [Webcast](#) beginning at 00:04:23.

Board Member Padilla-Campos asked how autobody shops will be informed about the amendments to PAR 1401. Committee Vice Chair Mitchell asked how many toxic air contaminants are listed in Rule 1401 and asked why our approach in handling pCBtF and t-BAC is different from other compounds. Ms. Farr described our outreach and explained that for coatings and solvents, the agency has taken a pollution prevention approach to have manufacturers reformulate their products, where feasible. Rita Loof, RadTech International, asked staff to provide additional information in the staff report about toxic free technologies that facilities can use to comply with Rule 1401 health risk thresholds.

David Rothbart, Clean Water SoCal, requested that all publicly owned co-composting facilities also be included in the Essential Public Service definition, while recommending that the eligibility be limited to only publicly owned composting facilities.

Mr. Eder encouraged consideration of the particulate matter emission reduction benefits of the proposed amendments.

Casey Corlis, Orange County Waste and Recycling, requested that all organics and composting processing equipment also be included in the definition for Essential Public Service.

Committee Vice Chair Mitchell commented on South Coast AQMD’s response to the recent Boyle Heights warehouse fire, emphasizing the heavy impact on a vulnerable environmental justice community. Executive Officer Wayne Nastri reported that over 100 South Coast AQMD staff mobilized rapidly in response to

both the recent Garden Grove and Boyle Heights incidents, deploying mobile monitoring labs within hours. Staff integrated live data onto the District website's Air Quality Index (AQI) maps and maintained a constant presence at the incident command to coordinate air quality monitoring with U.S EPA, and to ensure results were communicated to the local fire Chief, and public health officials. Committee Vice Chair Mitchell directed staff to agendaize an item for the August Board meeting to review the local AB 617 program and deploying air filtration units to heavily impacted residents during future environmental emergencies.
