REPORT: California Air Resources Board Monthly Meeting

SYNOPSIS: The California Air Resources Board held Board meetings on June 25, 2026 and July 23, 2026. The following is a summary of those meetings.

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The June 25 and July 23, 2026 Board meetings of the California Air Resources Board (Board) were held in Sacramento, California at the California Environmental Protection Agency Headquarters Building. The key items presented are summarized below.

DISCUSSION ITEMS – JUNE 25, 2026

26-4-1: Public Meeting to Consider Approval of the Proposed Fiscal Year 2025-26 and Fiscal Year 2026-27 Funding Plan for the Air Quality Improvement Program.

The Board approved the Proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-26 and Fiscal Year 2026-27 Funding Plan for the Air Quality Improvement Program (AQIP) Funding Plan. AQIP provides funding for incentives and plays a critical role by supporting early commercial zero emission technologies that ensure progress toward a zero-emission future while also balancing the need for near term oxides of nitrogen (NOx) reductions. The AQIP Funding Plan builds on the clean transportation incentive projects through which CARB has invested billions to support transformative changes in the mobile sector, with the majority of funds going to overburdened communities. The AQIP Funding Plan also supports CARB's Drive Forward effort by directing incentive investments toward technologies that expand access, accelerate deployment, and help fill the near term NOx shortfall.

26-4-2: Public Meeting to Consider the Community Air Protection (AB 617) Consultation Group Charter and Appointment of Members to the Consultation Group

The Board approved the Community Air Protection Consultation Group Charter and staff recommendations for new primary and alternate Consultation Group member appointments. In 2017, in response to Assembly Bill (AB) 617 (C. Garcia, Chapter 136, Statutes of 2017), CARB established the Community Air Protection Program to reduce criteria air pollutants and toxic air contaminant emissions in communities highly impacted by air pollution. The law requires CARB to develop a statewide strategy, known as the Blueprint, to achieve this goal and to do so in consultation with a Consultation Group comprised of local government, academia and community science, air districts, business and industry, tribal government, community-based and/or environmental justice organizations, the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, and the Scientific Review Panel on Toxic Air Contaminants. On March 25, 2026, the Consultation Group unanimously approved the draft Charter. The Board approved the Community Air Protection Consultation Group's draft Charter and appointed one new primary and five new alternate members to the Consultation Group.

DISCUSSION ITEMS- JULY 23, 2026

26-5-1: Public Meeting to Consider the Appointment of New Members to Assembly Bill 32 Environmental Justice Advisory Committee

The Board appointed 11 members and 2 alternates to the Assembly Bill (AB) 32 Environmental Justice Advisory Committee (Committee). AB 32 directed CARB, through Health and Safety Code section 38591, to convene a Committee of at least three members to advise the Board in developing the Scoping Plan and any other pertinent matter in implementing AB 32. Per statute, the Committee shall be comprised of representatives from communities in the state with the most significant exposure to air pollution, including, but not limited to, communities with minority populations or low-income populations, or both. The appointed candidates were selected through a public solicitation issued on February 20, 2026. The solicitation prioritized candidates who met the AB 32 statutory requirements, geographic diversity, environmental justice, and community experience. The newly appointed members will serve for a 36-month term, beginning on the date of their appointment. For more information on future meetings, please visit the Committee webpage.

26-5-2 Public Meeting to Consider the 2026 State Implementation Plan Revisions for the California Extreme Ozone Nonattainment Areas

The Board adopted the 2026 State Implementation Plan Revisions for the California Extreme Ozone Nonattainment Areas (2026 Extreme Ozone SIP Revision). The 2026 Extreme Ozone SIP Revision revises the 2022 State SIP Strategy measure commitments, aggregate emissions reduction commitments, and other elements as needed for the South Coast Air Basin, Coachella Valley, and San Joaquin Valley nonattainment areas. The 2026 Extreme Ozone SIP Revision was developed due to recent adverse federal actions, including the illegal disapproval of three previous federal actions waiving preemption for some of the State’s major vehicle and engines emissions control programs for mobile sources. Adoption of the 2026 Extreme Ozone SIP Revision to revise the 2022 State SIP Strategy measure commitments and other elements of the South Coast Air Basin, Coachella Valley and San Joaquin Valley nonattainment areas will support the approval of the attainment plans currently awaiting U.S. EPA action.

South Coast AQMD Staff Comments/Testimony: Staff highlighted the air quality challenges faced in South Coast AQMD, including the recent federal actions rolling back California rules. Staff supported CARB’s action to amend the State Implementation Plan to increase the emissions in the ‘Black Box’ for the 2015 ozone standard.

26-5-3 Public Meeting to Hear Community Air Protection Program Annual Progress Update

The Board heard an informational update on the progress of the Community Air Protection Program (CAPP), including related updates on newly adopted or approved Community Emissions Reduction Programs (CERPs), monitoring, enforcement, community and air grants activities. Assembly Bill (AB) 617 (Garcia, Chapter 136, Statutes of 2017) requires air districts to submit an annual implementation report to CARB for each CERP in their district. CARB staff presented highlights of the CAPP’s progress over the past year, including commitments outlined in Blueprint 2.0 and the status of CERP communities, key actions taken to implement CERPs, progress on CAPP Incentives, and collaborative efforts with community members, air districts, and CARB. In addition, staff provided updates on air quality monitoring, efforts to support consistently nominated communities through grants and other funding, and commitments for the upcoming year.

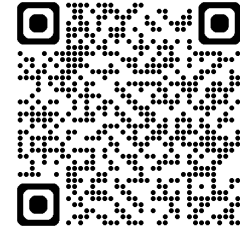

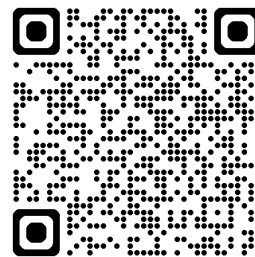
