### **Background**

This report summarizes the activities of the Legislative, Public Affairs and Media Office for November 2025. The report includes Major Events, Community Events/Public Meetings, Environmental Justice (EJ) Update, Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, Public Information Center, Small Business Assistance, Media Relations, and Outreach to Community Groups and Governments.

### **Major Events (Hosted and Sponsored)**

Each year, staff engage in hosting and sponsoring several major events throughout South Coast AQMD's four-county jurisdiction to promote, educate, and provide important information to the public regarding reducing air pollution, protecting public health, and improving air quality while minimizing economic impacts.

### Run With Los Muertos

On November 1, South Coast AQMD sponsored Run with Los Muertos, celebrating a centuries-old tradition by uniting approximately 6,000 attendees in Eastern Coachella Valley to celebrate health, wellness, and culture. South Coast AQMD staff hosted an information booth to provide attendees with information regarding Check Before You Burn (CBYB), Commercial and Residential Electric Lawn & Garden Equipment (eL&G) Programs, Replace Your Ride (RYR), the Residential EV Charging Incentive Program, wildfire safety, the South Coast AQMD Mobile App (Mobile App), how to file an air quality complaint, and the Coachella Valley Dust Summit.

### Coachella Valley Dust Summit

On November 6, South Coast AQMD hosted the Coachella Valley Dust Summit to listen to the community's concerns and provide the latest scientific information from various experts regarding dust-related emissions in the Coachella Valley. Approximately 100 people attended the hybrid meeting.

### The People's Collective for Environmental Justice

On November 8, South Coast AQMD sponsored The People's Collective for Environmental Justice's Weaving a New Path event in San Bernardino, which brought together approximately 180 attendees. The event also recognized community partners advocating for clean air and improved quality of life for residents living near transportation corridors, freight routes, and warehouses.

### Town Hall Meeting with Senator Caroline Menjivar

On November 15, South Coast AQMD participated in a Town Hall meeting hosted by Senator Caroline Menjivar to provide updates on amending South Coast AQMD's Rule 1157, enhanced compliance and enforcement efforts, and community engagement activities as well as to provide information on how to file an air quality complaint.

### **Community Events/Public Meetings**

Staff engaged with residents and stakeholders to provide information about the agency, incentive programs, and ways individuals can help reduce air pollution through events and meetings sponsored by South Coast AQMD or in partnership with others. Attendees typically receive information regarding the following:

- Tips on reducing their exposure to smog and its negative health effects;
- How to file a complaint;
- Clean air technologies and their deployment;
- Invitations to or notices of conferences, seminars, workshops, and other public events;
- South Coast AQMD incentive programs;
- Funding/grant opportunities by South Coast AQMD and partner agencies;
- Ways to participate in South Coast AQMD's rules and policy development; and
- Assistance in resolving air pollution-related problems.

### **Environmental Justice Update**

### **Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services**

### Archdiocese of Los Angeles – San Gabriel Valley Pastoral Region

On November 18, South Coast Air Quality Management District hosted Bishop Brian Nunes and Deacon Bill Pilkington. Vice Chair Cacciotti provided an overview of the agency, followed by a demonstration of electric gardening equipment by Dan Mabe of the American Green Zone Alliance and a tour of the laboratory. Staff presented information on several programs including GO ZERO, Commercial and Residential eL&G, and CAPES and WHAM.
