The May 28-29, 2026 Board meeting of the California Air Resources Board (Board) was held in Sacramento, California at the California Environmental Protection Agency Headquarters Building. The key items presented are summarized below.

CONSENT ITEM

26-3-1: Public Meeting to Consider the 2026 State Implementation Plan Revisions for the California Extreme Ozone Nonattainment Areas

26-3-2: Public Hearing to Consider Proposed Amendments to the Regulation for the Mandatory Reporting of Greenhouse Gas Emissions

26-3-3 Public Hearing to Consider Proposed Amendments to the Regulation for the California Cap on Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Market-Based Compliance Mechanisms

The Board approved amendments to the Regulation for the California Cap on Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions and Market-Based Compliance

Mechanisms (Cap- and-Invest Regulation), in addition to approving amendments to the regulation for the Mandatory Reporting of Greenhouse Gas Emissions (MRR). The Cap-and-Invest amendments reflect direction on the Cap-and-Invest Program provided in Assembly Bill 1207, signed by Governor Newsom on September 19, 2025, and support meeting California's climate targets, prioritizing affordability, support businesses and jobs, and support regulatory and market certainty. The amendments to the Cap-and- Invest Regulation are expected to result in significant GHG emissions reductions as well as air quality and health benefits and to provide economic benefits across the State. The program covers 80% of the state's GHG emissions from energy, industry, and manufacturing. The program will continue to have state auctions where the proceeds are deposited into Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF). Program expenditures utilizing GGRF revenues also provide additional reductions in emissions of fine particulate matter and oxides of nitrogen, resulting in benefits to public health. The changes are expected to deliver benefits to utility ratepayers, climate investments, and investment in California manufacturing. Most significantly, the removal of over 1 billion allowances through 2045 supports achieving California's statutory climate target for 2045 while keeping the state on track for the near-term 2030 target.

South Coast AQMD Staff Comments/Testimony: South Coast AQMD's Executive Officer joined six air districts and CAPCOA in providing testimony on the proposed amendments to CARB's Cap-and-Invest Regulation. Executive Officer Nastri commented that any reduction in GGRF revenues could significantly impact programs such as the Community Air Protection Program (AB 617) by substantially reducing or eliminating funding. He highlighted that residents of AB 617 and environmental justice communities continue to experience disproportionate exposure to air pollution, heightened impacts from climate change, and elevated rates of serious health conditions. The Executive Officer reaffirmed the commitment of South Coast AQMD and local air districts to serve as partners in advancing the state's shared clean air and climate goals.

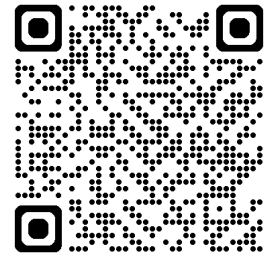
