Michael Krause, Assistant Deputy Executive Officer/Planning, Rule Development, and Implementation, gave the staff presentation on Agenda Item No. 29. For additional details, please refer to the [Webcast](#) beginning at 25:23.

Dr. Rutland commented on the need to consider the immunological and health impacts from exposure to poor air quality and toxic materials, including effects on individuals who handle or are exposed to these substances. Chair Cacciotti supported this perspective and requested that future staff presentations include health impact information to help the public understand the significance of these regulations. Supervisor Perez acknowledged the ongoing funding and staffing limitations but noted that it is essential to align community health experiences with scientific data and partner with public health agencies and local hospitals. Supervisor Mitchell highlighted the human costs borne by society and acknowledged that the Board's ongoing challenge to balance competing stakeholders' interests adds complexity to these matters. To address the request, Dr. Rees explained the calculations showing that emissions associated with the low-use exemption are below the 1 lb/day limit the requester is asking for. Comments from Chair Cacciotti, Vice Chair McCallon and Board Members Hagman, Rutland, Mitchell, Perez, Rodriguez, and Lock Dawson requested clarification and several expressed concern that both environmental and community, and industry representatives for the UV/EB/LED industry commented on similar issues that there were issues related to exemptions, use of diluents, and acknowledging the zero-emission UV/EB/LED technology that were not resolved on PAR 1136. Some Board Members also expressed public health concerns associated with delaying the amendments. The Board suggested that delaying action might be appropriate to allow staff to meet again with stakeholders to clarify concerns and explore the request for a low-VOC exemption approach.

Staff explained that UV/EB/LED commenters are conflating separate issues and clarified that these technologies do not inherently ensure low-VOC or non-toxic materials; therefore, a blanket exemption is not appropriate. Staff also explained that delaying PAR 1136 would not change its primary goal of eliminating t-BAC and pCBtF. Staff agreed to continued engagement with the stakeholders for further discussion.
