Background

This report summarizes the activities of the Legislative, Public Affairs and Media Office for August. The report includes Major Events, Community Events/Public Meetings, Environmental Justice (EJ) Update, Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, Public Information Center, Small Business Assistance, Media Relations, and Outreach to Community Groups and Governments.

Major Events (Hosted and Sponsored)

Each year, staff engage in hosting and sponsoring several major events throughout South Coast AQMD's four-county jurisdiction to promote, educate, and provide important information to the public regarding reducing air pollution, protecting public health, and improving air quality while minimizing economic impacts.

Clean Air, Clean Solutions Showcase, Sacramento

On August 3, South Coast AQMD partnered with Assemblymember José Luis Solache, the California Air Pollution Control Officers Association (CAPCOA), and California's local air districts to host the inaugural Clean Air, Clean Solutions Showcase at the State Capitol in Sacramento. The educational event highlighted how local air districts are improving air quality, protecting public health, addressing environmental justice issues, and supporting a stronger, cleaner economy through innovative technologies, community partnerships, and locally driven clean-air programs. The showcase also emphasized the critical role of state investments and public-private partnerships in accelerating the deployment of cleaner, lower-emission and zero-emission vehicles and equipment. The event attracted approximately 500 attendees, including Members of the Legislature, legislative and state agency staff, local government representatives, industry partners, community organizations, and members of the public.

2026 Inland Zero-Emission Vehicle Forum

On August 27, South Coast AQMD sponsored Western Riverside Clean Cities Coalition and Southern California Clean Cities Coalition's 2026 Inland Zero-Emission Vehicle Forum, a one-day event focused on advancing clean transportation and zero-emission infrastructure throughout Inland Southern California. Staff hosted an exhibitor table to provide information on Commercial Electric Lawn and Garden (eL&G) program, INVEST CLEAN, ELECTRIC, and Replace Your Ride (RYR) programs, as well as information on how to file an air quality complaint.

Community Events/Public Meetings

Staff engaged with residents and stakeholders of diverse communities to provide information about the agency, incentive programs, and ways individuals can help reduce air pollution through events and meetings sponsored by South Coast AQMD or in partnership with others. Attendees typically receive information regarding the following:

- Tips on reducing their exposure to smog and its negative health effects;
- How to file an air quality complaint;
- Clean air technologies and their deployment;
- Invitations to or notices of conferences, seminars, workshops, and other public events;
- South Coast AQMD incentive programs;
- Funding/grant opportunities by South Coast AQMD and partner agencies;
- Ways to participate in South Coast AQMD's rules and policy development; and
- Assistance in resolving air pollution-related problems.

- **Lineage Logistics:**
 - o **Odor Complaints:** LAist, CBS, NBC, and The LA Local inquired about updated odor complaint totals and reporting timeframes, NOV's, and air monitoring sites regarding the Lineage warehouse incident. Responses were provided.
 - o **Air Monitoring:** FOX, NBC, ABC, LAist and The LA Local inquired about air monitoring data, dashboard, and accuracy of readings near schools surrounding Lineage Logistics. The LA Reporter inquired about the consequences of not adhering to the deadlines. Response was provided. NBC inquired about the updates, penalties, and NOVs. Reporter had follow-up questions. Responses were provided.
