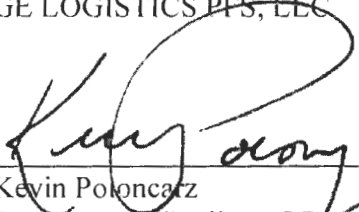

1 Introduction and Purpose

This Odor Management Plan ("Plan") was prepared by Onterris Response and Recovery ("Onterris") on behalf of Lineage Logistics ("Lineage") in response to the Los Palos Warehouse Fire in Los Angeles, CA. The incident occurred on June 17, 2026. The address of the incident site ("Site") is 1400 Los Palos St, and GPS coordinates for the approximate location of the site are (34.016206, -118.193063)

The fire resulted in a loss of power to the facility's refrigeration systems, leaving perishable food products on site to decompose and generate strong, objectionable odors. In addition, fire suppression water, runoff, and waste materials produced during recovery and demolition activities have the potential to generate offensive odors.

The Site is surrounded by sensitive receptors, including nearby residential neighborhoods and commercial properties, making effective odor management an important component of the response.

This Odor Management Plan has been developed to support Incident Command by establishing procedures to identify, minimize, monitor, and mitigate odors associated with the fire and subsequent response, recovery, and demolition activities, with the goal of reducing impacts to surrounding communities. The operations described in this plan will be implemented and managed by the Operations Section.

A separate Air Sampling and Analysis Plan has been developed for the site.

2 Health and Safety

Personnel involved in odor management will review and adhere to any Site-Specific Health and Safety Plan. Activities will only be completed in a safe manner and under safe conditions as dictated by the Site-Specific Health and Safety Plan. Operations will be conducted in a manner so as to not pose a risk to worker, equipment, or the general public.

3 Site Odor Management

The following operations are proposed to manage odor emanating from the building:

- The damaged portion of building has been wrapped with plastic sheeting to contain debris, odor, dust, etc. during demolition operations. The condition of the wrapping will be inspected and maintained daily, and repairs will be made if damage or wear and tear is observed.
- Carbon filters are being installed at doorways on Los Palos St and Union Pacific Ave to allow the building to vent while mitigating the odor emanating from the building.

- Odor-neutralizing mist systems have been deployed around the perimeter of the building/fence. A map of the current location of perimeter misting systems is provided in **Attachment A**. The SDS of the deodorizer product (JPD) is provided in **Attachment B**. Misting system numbers and locations may be adjusted as needed, based on current demolition and waste movement operations, as well as wind direction. Misting systems will be serviced daily to ensure they are functional.
- Containment and management of water runoff – see separate Water Management Plan.
- Daily washing of two onsite locations with cleaner or bleach solution to wash runoff that has seeped from the building into the onsite drainage system. Washing occurs in two locations:
 - on the loading dock on the south side of the building; and
 - on parking lot along the west side of the building
- The SDS' of the cleaner (Simple Green) and bleach product are provided in **AttachmentB¹**. These products will not be mixed.

4 Waste Odor Management

Waste containment will be staged at the loading dock on the south side of the building.

4.1 Solid Wastes

- Waste will be managed in accordance with the current version of the Emergency Waste Managemnet, Characterization and Disposal Work Plan ("Waste Management Plan").
- Live loading of waste trucks will be maximized. This will reduce the volume of waste stored on site and therefore the potential for odor generation at the staging area.
- Rolloffs/trucks will be lined to prevent spillage onto pad/streets.
- After loading, containers without mechanical lids will be sprayed with Rusmar Long Duration Foam AC-645, an aqueous surfactant used at disposal and other waste facilities for odor and VOC control. The SDS of Rusmar Foam is provided in **Attachment B**.
- Wastes stockpiled within the building may also be sprayed with Rusmar Foam, where safely accessible, to control odors within the building.
- The waste staging area will be inspected daily, per the Waste Management Plan to ensure:
 - Rolloffs/trucks are kept tightly covered when not being loaded
 - Rolloffs/trucks are not leaking materials onto the pad or street

4.2 Liquids

- Frac tank valves will be kept tightly closed when not in use, Frac tanks will be staged within secondary containment berms
- The waste staging area will be monitored closely to ensure:
 - Frac tank valves are closed
 - Secondary containment berms are free of spilled liquids

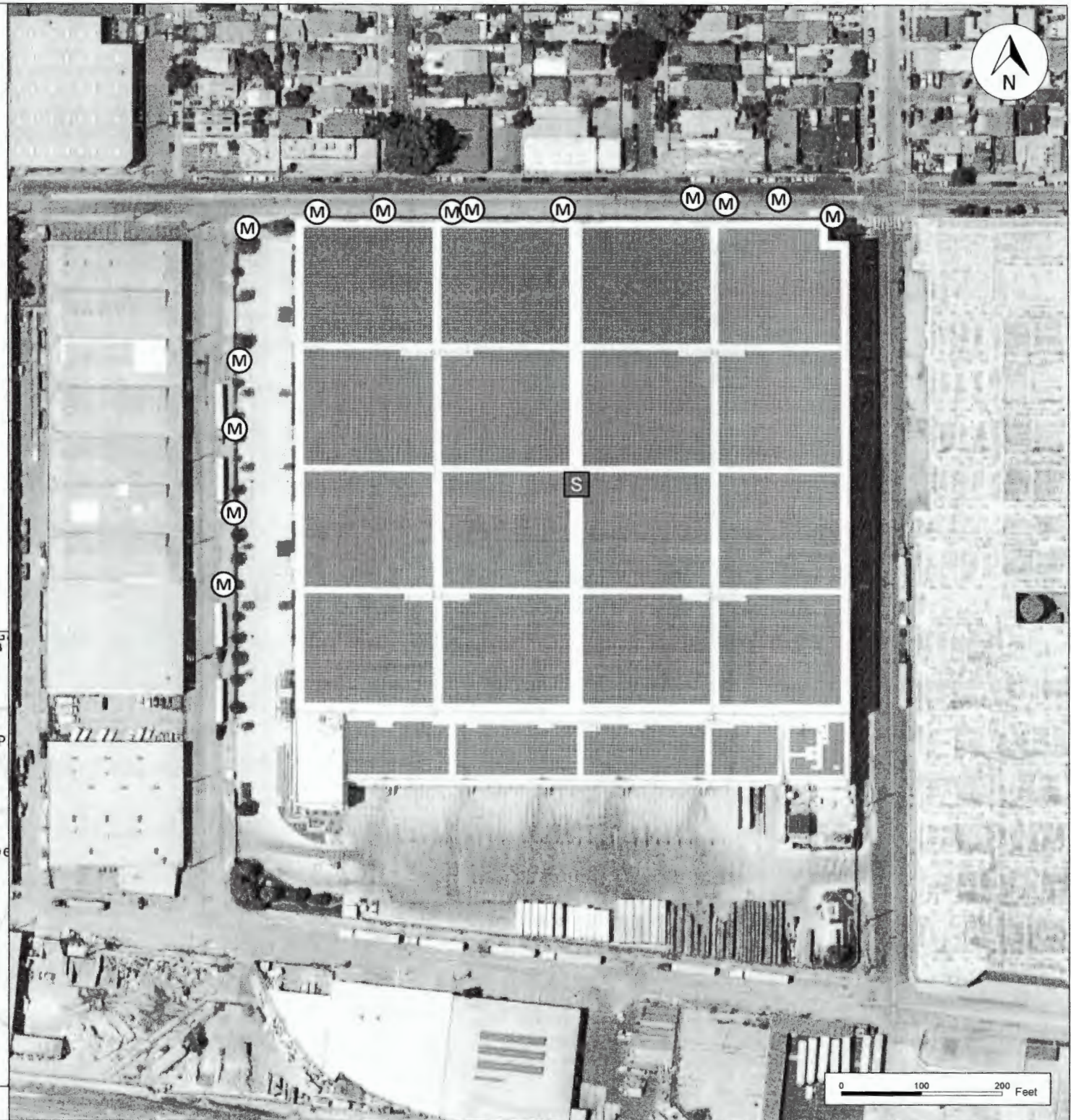


Odor Mister Locations

Dear Mr. Lehmkuhl and Mr. DiCarlo,

The South Coast AQMD has serious concerns regarding the ongoing air quality issues impacting the community surrounding the Lineage warehouse in Boyle Heights. This past week alone, our agency has responded to over 900 odor complaints, resulting in multiple enforcement actions alleging public nuisance.

The South Coast AQMD's foremost responsibility is to protect public health through ensuring compliance with air quality regulations. While our agency recognizes Lineage is implementing its Odor Management Plan dated July 12, 2026, included as Attachment 1, throughout the clean-up efforts, the significant increase in community complaints and resulting violations demonstrate that a more robust approach is necessary. The surrounding community deserves meaningful and measurable improvements without delay.

Today, a South Coast AQMD senior team visited the Lineage warehouse and met with representatives from Lineage, Clean Harbors Environmental Services, and Onterris to better understand odor mitigation measures that are being implemented. Accordingly, the South Coast AQMD has identified additional measures to address ongoing nuisance concerns. Specifically, we urge Lineage to immediately implement the measures outlined in Attachment 2. South Coast AQMD understands the clean-up is dynamic as work is being done in Buildings 1 and 2. We also recognize the measures may need to be modified over the duration of the clean-up and want to work with Lineage to ensure odors impacting the community are minimized and public health is protected.

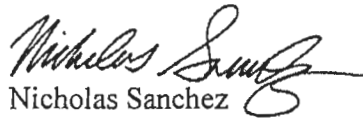

Additional Measures in Lineage Logistics Odor Management Plan

1. Background

- a. Building 1: Building generally intact, no refrigeration, full of food (mainly meat and seafood)
- b. Building 2: Fire damaged, wall on Indiana is the working face

2. General Measures for Buildings 1 and 2

a. Misting System

- i. Existing Measure: Continue implementing misting measures in Odor Management Plan.

b. Wind Break Plan on Indiana Street

- i. New Measure:
 1. Submit a Wind Break Plan to minimize wind tunnel effects on Indiana Street to minimize impacts to downwind receptors while waste is being live loaded on Indiana Street and while any odor generating activities occur in Building 2.
 2. Install a wind monitoring station to develop work stoppage criteria.

c. Loading of Trucks

i. Existing Measures:

1. Conduct live loading of trucks as specified in Odor Management Plan.
2. Line roll-offs/trucks to prevent spillage onto pad/streets as specified in Odor Management Plan.

ii. New Measures:

1. Apply odor neutralizer prior to and during loading, including during excavation of the waste material.
2. Minimize drop height of decomposing food and waste from the loader bucket to the truck.
3. Load trucks as close to the building as safely and reasonably possible.
4. Cover each truck with either a solid covering or a vinyl tarp or the equivalent. If a vinyl tarp or the equivalent is used, operator shall use an odor containment material such as Rusmar on the decomposing food and waste.
5. Solid covering of trucks shall be used for:
 - a. Particularly odorous loads;
 - b. Loads that will be stored for 8 hours or more at or near the site;

6. Operator shall specify a timeframe to completely cover a loaded truck; and
7. Operator shall specify a timeframe to apply Rusmar.

d. Loaded Trucks (New Measures)

- i. Any loaded truck that will be sitting at or near the property for 8 or more hours, shall be covered with a solid cover and sealed to minimize the potential for odors.
- ii. A canopy or shade cover shall be placed over any loaded truck that will be sitting for more than 12 hours.

e. Housekeeping

i. Existing Measures:

1. Continue daily washing of areas using the methods specified in the Odor Management Plan.
2. Inspect the waste staging area daily, pursuant to the Waste Management Plan to ensure:
 - a. Roll-offs/trucks are kept tightly covered when not being loaded; and
 - b. Roll-offs/trucks are not leaking materials onto the pad or street (from Odor Management Plan).

ii. New Measures

1. Daily washing includes any areas with runoff, not just runoff that seeped into onsite drainage system.
2. Daily washing where there is any track out or runoff, or openings such on Indiana St.
3. Daily washing of any loading areas that are outside of the building and any equipment operated in the building that will remain outside of the building.
4. Do not allow liquids from materials or clean-up materials to pool and create odors. Use power washing devices and heated water, if possible.
5. Empty and wash drains used to collect runoff once per day.
6. Conduct daily mobile wet scrubber sweeping, a quarter mile or to the first major street from the facility, on any street(s) where loaded trucks are traversing.

f. Encapsulation and Control of Odorous Waste

i. New Measures

1. Apply odor encapsulant material (e.g. Posi-Lock) via appropriate spray or hydroseeding equipment to odorous waste material, to create a physical crust over the waste surface to prevent odor migration.

2. Prior to or via the odor encapsulant material application, apply odor neutralizer to the odorous waste material to ensure that odors are neutralized while they are encapsulated to further reduce odor migration.
3. Incorporate routine odor surveillance and visual inspection of the encapsulant material on a regular basis (e.g. weekly) to determine the condition of the encapsulant material. If cracks, separation, or other degradation of the encapsulant material is identified, additional encapsulant material or other vapor barrier material shall be applied to the degraded areas of encapsulant material as soon as possible to mitigate odor migration.
4. As encapsulated waste material is excavated for removal, encapsulant material shall be applied to or on top of the remaining exposed waste material when excavation has ceased for the day.

g. Signage (New Measure)

- i. Install signs stating, "TO REPORT AIR QUALITY ISSUES SUCH AS ODORS, DUST, OR SMOKE FROM THIS FACILITY, CALL THE SOUTH COAST AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT AT 1-800-CUT-SMOG".
 1. Install signs within 50 feet of the main entrance of the facility and in a location on each side of the facility that is visible to the public;
 2. Sign shall measure at least 16 square feet; and
 3. Lettering at least 3 inches tall with text contrasting with the sign background.

h. Community Communication Plan (New Measures)

- i. Develop a plan to communicate to the public the status and anticipated activities that provides:
 1. Truck routes
 2. Status updates
 3. Anticipated work that may significantly result in odor nuisance
 4. Include an onsite environmental coordinator that is responsible for:
 - a. Conducting odor surveillance around the perimeter of the facility at least three times per day;
 - b. Ensuring measures in the Odor Management Plan are implemented; and
 - c. Answering community concerns
- ii. Notify the community if any of the following occurs:
 1. Wall between Building 1 and 2 is opened;
 2. Opening of plastic covering on Union Pacific or Indiana is needed while decomposing food or waste is being moved;
 3. Accidental collapse of building structure; or

4. Significant spills of odorous materials or wastewater.

3. Measures Specific to Building 1 (New Measures)

- a. Before any decomposing food or waste is moved out of Building 1, wrap decomposing food or waste, or place in a sealed containment within the building.
 - i. Utilize temporary, enclosed vestibules vented to air pollution control equipment if materials are brought out of Building 1 before being placed in containment.
- b. Submit a detailed Odor Management Plan for how waste will be removed from Building 1 that includes the phases, staging of materials, how materials will be loaded on trucks, housekeeping, and timeframe.
- c. The middle wall between Building 1 and 2 has a significant opening from the fire damage. The Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) Units will only control emissions that are collected by the ventilation system. Significant emissions of ammonia and VOC from the decomposition of organic materials are expected to escape the intended enclosure with the current configuration. Conduct smoke tests to demonstrate inward airflow for the Building 1 opening (including opening(s) at the roof). Perform the smoke test during daytime high temperatures. Subsequent to the smoke test, plastic sheeting shall be used to close any openings that indicated outward air flow from the structure. Specify the timeline for how quickly plastic sheeting will be applied to the areas of indicated outward air flow.
- d. Monitor the inlet and outlet of GAC units for VOC at least once every shift to ensure proper control of captured emissions. All monitoring results shall be documented and maintained in a daily log and made available to South Coast AQMD upon request.
- e. Conduct sampling at the inlet and outlet of GAC units for speciated organic compounds using a South Coast AQMD approved method (e.g. EPA TO-15). All results shall be maintained and made available to South Coast AQMD upon request. Sampling shall also include ammonia at the inlet and outlet of the units.
- f. Immediately shut down GAC units showing initial signs of breakthrough based on emissions monitoring.
- g. Maintain standby GAC units either at a readily accessible off-site storage location or on-site to accommodate timely GAC replacement to prevent and limit GAC breakthrough conditions.
- h. Monitor building pressure with three differential pressure monitoring systems on three different walls. Seal areas of positive differential pressure to the maximum extent possible.
- i. Any damage or wear and tear in the plastic sheeting shall be repaired or replaced within 72 hours.

4. Measures Specific to Building 2

- a. Existing Measures:

- i. Install carbon filters are being installed at doorways on Los Palos St and Union Pacific Ave at outlined in Odor Management Plan;
 - ii. Wrap damaged portion of the building as specified in Odor Management Plan; and
 - iii. Conduct daily inspections of wrapping as specified in Odor Management Plan.
- b. New Measures:
 - i. Containment
 - 1. Plastic sheeting is not required for the portion of the building where material is being actively worked on and shall provide sufficient space for the ingress and egress of equipment, materials and workers.
 - 2. Any damage or wear and tear in the plastic sheeting shall be repaired or replaced within 72 hours.
 - ii. Utilize products (e.g. Posi-lock) identified above in “Encapsulation of Odorous Waste” to create a solid, sealed barrier to prevent odorous emissions from organic debris in open air areas. Application of products shall be based on suggested timeframes from the manufacturer.
 - 1. Upon removal of all solid waste from Building 2, power wash, clean and disinfect concrete flooring.

5. Wastewater System (New Measures)

- a. Provide South Coast AQMD details on wastewater collection and storage system, locations of potential emissions where wastewater is open to air, products and compounds added to the wastewater, and lab analysis of wastewater tanks.
- b. Provide Rule 219 permit exemption for wastewater tanks or submit permit applications for tanks to South Coast AQMD, as appropriate.
- c. Include truck loading activities of sludge and/or wastewater in the Odor Management Plan. Significant odors were observed next to tanks containing wastewater.
- d. Keep all vessels containing wastewater closed, sealed, or vented to air pollution control. Air pollution control and odor mitigation strategies shall be evaluated in the Odor Management Plan for identified sources of wastewater odors.

6. Recordkeeping (New Measure)

- a. Log date, time, duration of work stoppages due to the emission of air contaminants. Include reasons for work stoppage, any measurements of air contaminants, and location of measurement.

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- **Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program**

Certain Notices of Violation may be eligible for resolution through SCAQMD's Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program if they are issued to a minor source or for violations other than emitting air toxics or creating a

public nuisance involving injury or property damage.

If your case is handled by this program, you will receive a letter or phone call from an investigator in the SCAQMD General Counsel's office offering to settle your violation. Settlement terms usually call for a penalty payment and written proof of current compliance. The investigator's name and telephone number are included in the initial settlement letter in the event you would like to discuss the case.

Be prepared to describe any facts about the violation that you believe SCAQMD should know in considering your case. Sharing your knowledge of the facts, possible causes for the violation and plans to avoid future violations will help the investigator arrive at an appropriate disposition. **Be sure to respond by the date indicated in the letter to avoid further legal action.**

If the Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program fails to result in a settlement, your Notice of Violation may be referred to an SCAQMD attorney and handled under the procedures for Civil Prosecution or resolved through a Small Claims Court.

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If your case is handled as a civil matter, it will be reviewed by an attorney from the SCAQMD General Counsel's office, who will typically make first contact with you through a letter that asks for information about your case. If the allegations in the Notice of Violation cannot be informally resolved, the SCAQMD is authorized to file a civil lawsuit in court to recover civil penalties. In cases involving serious harm or danger, however, SCAQMD may immediately commence a legal action for civil penalties and a court-ordered injunction. A **mandatory injunction** is a court order compelling a person and/or company to take specific action. A **prohibitory injunction** is a court order compelling a person and/or company to refrain from taking a specific action. Injunctions, which may even lead to shutting down a business, may be sought by SCAQMD to prevent continuing or serious violations or damages from occurring.

What is a Notice of Violation?

A Notice of Violation is issued by an SCAQMD Air Quality Inspector to inform a business that a failure to comply with one or more applicable federal, state, and/or local (SCAQMD) air pollution rules and regulations or legal requirements is being alleged.

What happens when I receive a Notice of Violation?

If you are operating in violation of one or more applicable federal, state, and/or local (SCAQMD) air pollution rules and regulations or legal requirements, each day or part of a day that you operate in violation is considered a separate violation even if only one Notice of Violation has been issued. Continuing to operate in violation may subject you to substantial civil or criminal penalties. **It is in your best interest to resolve any compliance problem immediately before you resume operation.**

What if I need to continue to operate the equipment named in the Notice of Violation?

If continued operation of equipment cited in the Notice of Violation is necessary, you may be able to obtain a variance from SCAQMD's Hearing Board. A **variance** is an administrative order that allows a company to continue operating without penalties while it takes appropriate steps to meet air pollution control requirements. Proof of specific legal circumstances must be provided before a variance can be granted. Timeliness in seeking such relief will be considered by the Hearing Board. Additional information concerning variances can be found in California Health & Safety Code §§ 42350-42359.5 and at <http://www.aqmd.gov/home/about/hearing-board>.

During a hearing for a variance, you may be represented either by yourself or by your attorney or consultant. You will have the opportunity to present evidence and testimony, and to cross-examine any SCAQMD witness.

If you fail to comply with any order of the Hearing Board, you may be subject to additional civil or criminal penalties set forth in California Health & Safety Code §§ 42400 *et seq.* and 42402 *et seq.*

How are Notices of Violation resolved?

The SCAQMD General Counsel's office reviews each alleged violation and, based on the facts, determines how best to resolve the allegation. Options available to the General Counsel's office include:

- **Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program**

Certain Notices of Violation may be eligible for resolution through SCAQMD's Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program if they are issued to a minor source or for violations other than emitting air toxics or creating a

public nuisance involving injury or property damage.

If your case is handled by this program, you will receive a letter or phone call from an investigator in the SCAQMD General Counsel's office offering to settle your violation. Settlement terms usually call for a penalty payment and written proof of current compliance. The investigator's name and telephone number are included in the initial settlement letter in the event you would like to discuss the case.

Be prepared to describe any facts about the violation that you believe SCAQMD should know in considering your case. Sharing your knowledge of the facts, possible causes for the violation and plans to avoid future violations will help the investigator arrive at an appropriate disposition. **Be sure to respond by the date indicated in the letter to avoid further legal action.**

If the Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program fails to result in a settlement, your Notice of Violation may be referred to an SCAQMD attorney and handled under the procedures for Civil Prosecution or resolved through a Small Claims Court.

- **Civil Prosecution**

If your case is handled as a civil matter, it will be reviewed by an attorney from the SCAQMD General Counsel's office, who will typically make first contact with you through a letter that asks for information about your case. If the allegations in the Notice of Violation cannot be informally resolved, the SCAQMD is authorized to file a civil lawsuit in court to recover civil penalties. In cases involving serious harm or danger, however, SCAQMD may immediately commence a legal action for civil penalties and a court-ordered injunction. A **mandatory injunction** is a court order compelling a person and/or company to take specific action. A **prohibitory injunction** is a court order compelling a person and/or company to refrain from taking a specific action. Injunctions, which may even lead to shutting down a business, may be sought by SCAQMD to prevent continuing or serious violations or damages from occurring.

- **Criminal Prosecution**

If SCAQMD determines that criminal prosecution is appropriate, the case will be referred to the appropriate state or federal law enforcement agency. That agency will determine if criminal prosecution is warranted.

Civil and Criminal Penalties

Penalties are determined by California Health & Safety Code §§ 42400 *et seq.* and 42402 *et seq.*
