Good morning, members of the Board.

My name is Cynthia Rios, and I urge you to reject or significantly amend the proposed joint stipulation.

For over 50 days, my family has been forced to live with an unbearable chemical odor. We've had to keep our windows and doors closed, avoid being outside, and worry every day about what we're breathing.

I have a 1-year-old daughter, and at this crucial stage of her development, she cannot safely spend time outdoors. Instead of exploring, playing, and getting fresh air like every child deserves, she's been confined inside because we don't know if the air is safe. No parent should have to make that choice.

I ask this Board to require 24/7 continuous public air monitoring, sealed negative-pressure containment with air scrubbers during cleanup, and independent third-party testing and oversight. The company responsible for this disaster should not be deciding who gets help or whether their own cleanup is safe.

Please put the health of our children and our community before the convenience of the company that caused this crisis.
