Interim Measures Workplan for Former Northrop Grumman East Complex

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) staff appreciates the opportunity to comment on the above-mentioned document and would like to be included in future public participation activities associated with the cleanup effort at the Former Northrop Grumman East Complex (Site, Facility, or Proposed Project). The purpose of the Interim Measures Workplan (Workplan)¹ is to remove volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in groundwater and soil at the site. If remediation or any onsite activity involves equipment or operations which either emits or controls air pollution, South Coast AQMD staff should be consulted in advance to determine whether or not any permits or plans are required to be filed and approved by South Coast AQMD prior to start of any remedial activity. The following comments are intended to provide guidance to the Lead Agency and should be incorporated into the Workplan, as appropriate.

As stated above, VOCs are found in groundwater and soil. Disturbing soils that may contain petroleum hydrocarbons are subject to the requirements of South Coast AQMD Rule 1166 – Volatile Organic Compound Emissions from Decontamination of Soil². South Coast AQMD Rule 1166 should be incorporated during the development of the Workplan. Furthermore, the Workplan should also discuss how the remedial measures will comply with South Coast AQMD Rule 402 – Nuisance³, in the event that the VOCs and/or odors are emitted during soil disturbance activities.
