In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD), as Lead Agency, has prepared a Draft Subsequent Environmental Impact Report (Draft SEIR) for the proposed project identified above. This letter, the attached Notice of Completion (NOC), and the Draft SEIR serve the following purposes: 1) to notify the public that the South Coast AQMD assessed the potential adverse environmental impacts that may result from implementing the proposed project; and 2) to allow public agencies and the public (collectively referred to as the public) the opportunity to review and comment on the environmental analysis.

This letter and the attached NOC for the Draft SEIR are not South Coast AQMD applications or forms requiring a response from you. Their purpose is to provide information to you on the proposed project. No action on your part is necessary if the proposed project has no bearing on you or your organization.

Comments focusing on your area of expertise, your agency's area of jurisdiction, if applicable, or issues relative to the environmental analysis in the Draft SEIR will be accepted during a 45-day public review and comment period beginning September 30, 2025 and ending at 5:00 p.m. on November 14, 2025. Please note that under the California Public Records Act (Gov. Code Section 7920.000) your written and oral comments, attachments, and associated contact information (e.g., your address, phone, email, etc.) become part of the public record and can be released to the public on request, or posted on the South Coast AQMD website.

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project: The proposed project aims to further reduce odors at the Sunshine Canyon Landfill and prevent fugitive releases of methane (CH4), which is a potent greenhouse gas (GHG), and toxic air contaminants that are present in landfill gas (LFG) by increasing the flaring capacity of the gas control and collection system to combust the maximum amount of LFG that is estimated to be generated in the future. The applicant seeks modifications to its existing permits to: 1) install and operate two additional LFG flares and two additional 300-horsepower electric blowers; and 2) increase the permitted site-wide LFG combustion limit from 16,100 standard cubic feet per minute (scfm) to 33,334 scfm, corrected to 50 percent CH4 and averaged over 24 hours. No component of the proposed project is expected to expand landfill capacity or increase the amount of waste that can be accepted on a daily, monthly, or annual basis. The Draft SEIR, which tiers off of the December 1999 Final SEIR for the Sunshine Canyon Landfill, concluded that significant and unavoidable adverse environmental impacts may occur for the topics of air quality and GHG emissions from operation of the LFG flares. No other significant adverse impacts were identified. This facility is not identified on lists compiled by the California Department of Toxic Substances Control per Government Code Section 65962.5.
