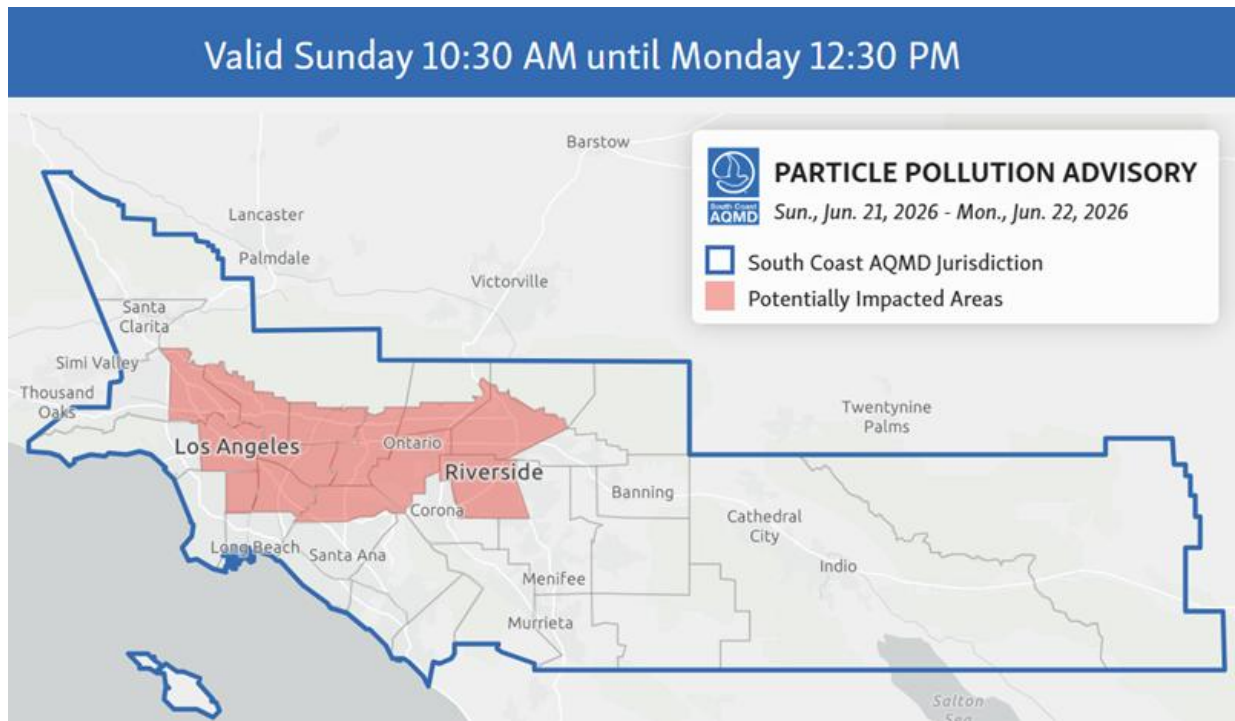

South Coast AQMD Extends Particle Pollution Advisory Due to Structure Fire in Boyle Heights

Valid until Monday 12:30 PM



Current Conditions

This is not a shelter-in-place order.

Smoke from a large structure fire in Boyle Heights that started on June 17 is impacting air quality throughout the region. As of 10:00 AM on Sunday, the fire is actively producing smoke and firefighting efforts are likely to continue.

Regulatory monitors and sensors show that PM2.5 levels reached **Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups** to **Very Unhealthy** Air Quality Index (AQI) categories since Saturday night in the areas of central Los Angeles County, San Gabriel Valley, East San Fernando Valley and Northwest San Bernardino Valley.

Forecasted Air Quality Impacts

- As firefighting efforts progress, smoke will continue to affect air quality throughout the region. Impacts will be highly variable in space and time.
- The combination of smoke and high humidity may cause visibility issues overnight.
- Ash may also deposit across the area. Air quality monitors do not account for large ash particles and debris in the AQI readings. Take precautions to protect your health if you smell or see smoke or ash.

Detailed Forecast

Sunday Afternoon	The most significant smoke impacts are expected north and east of the fire in areas such as the San Gabriel Valley and portions of the western Inland Empire. Significant smoke impacts are likely to continue in areas immediately adjacent to the fire throughout East Los Angeles and Boyle Heights.
Sunday Evening	Smoke will continue to impact East Los Angeles, Boyle Heights, and the San Gabriel Valley in addition to northern Orange County. Light winds will also allow for the smoke to disperse in all directions from the fire, potentially leading to impacts throughout the metropolitan Los Angeles region.
Monday Morning	Smoke impacts are expected north and east of the fire in areas such as East Los Angeles, Boyle Heights, and the San Gabriel Valley.

South Coast AQMD will issue an update if additional information becomes available.

If you are in impacted area:

- Limit your exposure by remaining indoors with windows and doors closed or seeking alternate shelter.
- Avoid vigorous physical activity.

- Run your air conditioning and/or an air purifier. If possible, do **not** use swamp coolers or whole house fans that bring in outside air.
