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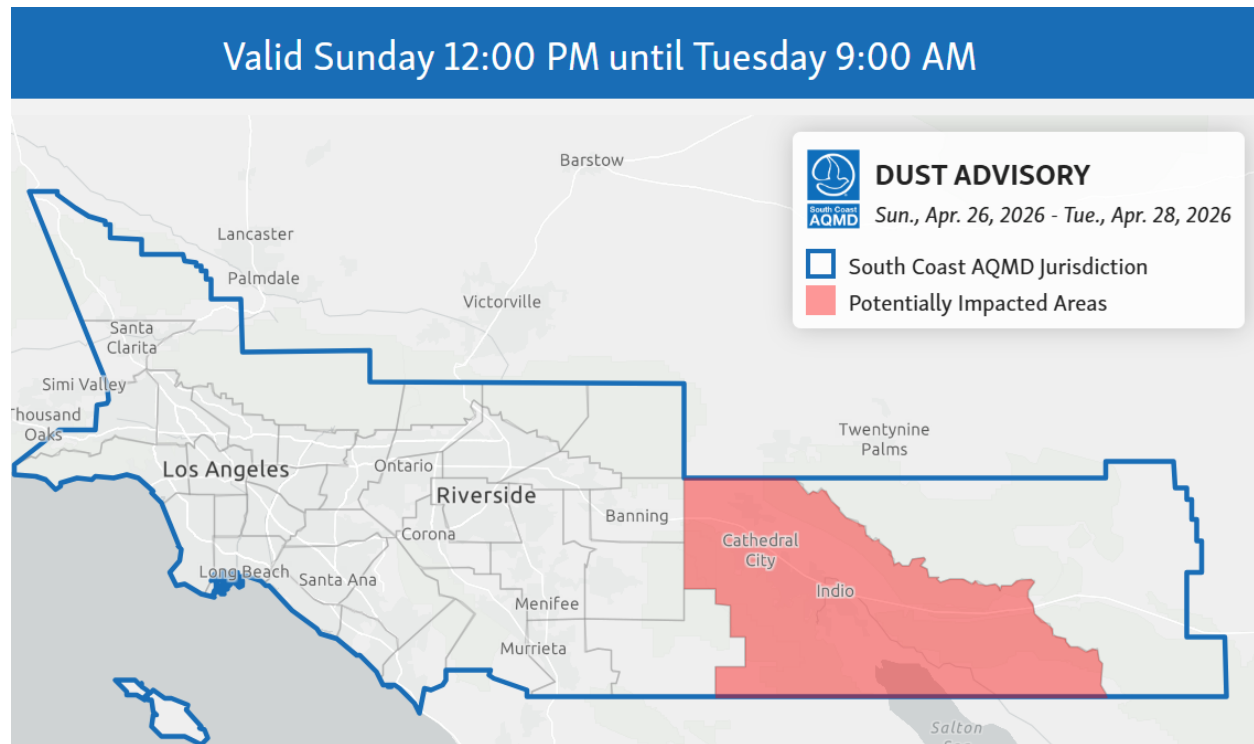
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South Coast AQMD Issues Windblown Dust Advisory for the Coachella Valley

Valid until Tuesday 9:00 AM



Current Conditions

- As of Sunday at noon, the National Weather Service (NWS) has issued wind advisory for Coachella Valley. Visit the NWS San Diego website www.weather.gov/sgx/ for more information.

Forecasted Air Quality Impacts

- Windblown dust and high particle pollution (PM10) in the **Unhealthy** or higher air quality index (AQI) categories are expected at times from 12 PM Sunday through Tuesday morning in the Northern Coachella Valley. In the other areas of Coachella Valley, **Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups** or higher AQI categories are expected at times from 12 PM Sunday through Tuesday morning.
- Windblown dust is due to high winds with gusts up to 40-50 mph expected through Tuesday morning in the Northern Coachella Valley.

Detailed Forecast

Sunday	Starting from 12 PM Sunday to 11:59 PM Sunday night, Unhealthy or higher AQI is expected at times in the Northern Coachella Valley and Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups in the other areas of the Coachella Valley.
Monday morning	Wind speeds are predicted to decrease in the daytime and Good to Moderate AQI level is expected.
Monday afternoon through Tuesday morning	Wind speeds are expected to increase again after 2 PM Monday in the Coachella Valley area and the highest wind speeds are predicted Monday night. Unhealthy or higher AQI is expected at times in the Northern Coachella Valley and Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups in the other areas of the Coachella Valley.

South Coast AQMD will issue an update if additional information becomes available.

If you are in an area impacted by windblown dust:

- Limit your exposure by remaining indoors with windows and doors closed or seeking alternate shelter.
- Avoid vigorous physical activity.
- Run your air conditioning and/or an air purifier. If possible, do not use swamp coolers or whole house fans that bring in outside air.
- Help minimize dust pollution by stabilizing loose soils and slowing down if driving on dirt roads.
