Re: Support for Proposed Rules 1111+1121 – Strong Support for Passing Life-Saving Regulation

Chair McCallon & Members of the Stationary Source Committee,

The Sierra Club is pleased to submit this letter on behalf of our over 33,000 members across the South Coast Region who stand in strong support of these rules. The 624 undersigned individuals have submitted comments and show strong support for passing strong Amended Rules 1111+1121 which would allow for the gradual shifting away from fossil fuel-powered appliances to highly efficient, clean alternatives over the coming years. This switch would help Californians upgrade to modern appliances across the region, replacing gas furnaces with heat pumps.

We are thankful for all the work the staff and board have done to incorporate meaningful feedback to pass strong rules that work for everyone with reasonable exemptions. However, recent changes to the rules have weakened their benefits for local communities in the South Coast region.

Recent revisions to the rules driven by the fossil fuel industry and its allies have significantly delayed pollution reductions that communities living with some of the worst air quality in the country urgently need, while reducing overall pollution reductions.

As such, we are respectfully requesting the following amendments to the rule:

- Accelerate the timeline for zero-emission NOx appliance targets to meet or exceed the state's commitments;
- Tier the non-compliance fee for each NOx-emitting unit sold above the sales target based on the degree of manufacturer non-compliance;
- Tie the per-unit mitigation fee for polluting appliances to the cost of health impacts from the NOx pollution emitted over its lifetime; and
- Eliminate the proposed discounted mitigation fee.

We have seen the gas industry continue to succeed in watering down these rules, and we fear that these continued changes will allow industry to continue polluting with minimal

repercussions. This will result in trapping our over 17 million residents of the South Coast into years of pollution.

The Sierra Club is committed to supporting rules that will strengthen the benefits promised in the previous proposal that slashed emissions, protect people's health, and are good for the climate. We look forward to continuing to work with the board, staff and partners to pass these rules in May.
