Valero introduced the Head Start Program to prepare Wilmington Children before they entered elementary school. Valero has invested millions in Wilmington over the years to various non-profits and schools but just not their money their time and talents!

While I may not be as familiar with the Torrance Refinery, I have attended most of the working group meetings, talked with some of their management team and they have made a commitment in writing and action to implement in a reasonable period of time Five Tier 11 recommendations along with one or more of the Tier 111 recommendations. I have been impressed with their commitment to the community and the financial and human resources they have made to continually improve the refining operations in Torrance. They have worked closely with the Cal OSHA, the EPA, Torrance and County Fire Departments to ensure a safe and secure operation.

I live in Wilmington and over 25% of our population live within the poverty level; this means that higher fuel prices impact them dramatically and good jobs can have significant impacts for their futures. Working out MOU's with our refineries will ensure our regions safe, clean and reliable fuel supplies.
